# From Pastor David

"But it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Savior, Christ Jesus, who has destroyed death and has brought life and immortality to light through the gospel."

-2 Timothy 1:10

It was the night of October 31, 1936. Halloween night. The men and women sat at the round table with joined hands. They awaited the message - the message they had hoped for every Halloween night for the past 10 years. But the message did not come.

Finally, one woman rose from the table and announced to the others - and to a listening radio audience - "Houdini did not come through," she said. "My last hope is gone. I do not believe that Houdini can come back to me, or to anyone...The Houdini Shrine has burned for ten years. I now, reverently... turn out the light. It is finished. Good night, Harry!"

The woman was Bess Houdini, wife of the famed magician and escape artist. And this was the last séance she would participate in to try to contact her dead husband.

Shortly before his death, Houdini made a pact with Bess that if he could, he would return and make contact with her from the other side. They devised a coded message that only he and Bess knew; this would prove that it really was Houdini breaking through from the afterlife. But after 10 séances in 10 years, Bess had not received her beloved husband's personal message.

Houdini was known as "The Man No Jail Could Hold." Yet he could not escape from the strongest prison of all: death. The greatest escape artist the world has ever known was as trapped as everyone else.

Jesus, however, was able to do what Houdini could not. Jesus actually did break out of the prison of death. Jesus was no mere escape artist, though. No illusions or tricks. Instead of escaping from death, Jesus conquered it—first by fully and personally experiencing it, and then winning a victory of power over it. Jesus fully—and with His own blood—paid the price for all sin. Then God raised up Jesus from the dead, with a decisive move of power greater than even that which has power over everything else. The good news is that the resurrected Jesus offers the victory He has won to all who would become His disciple.

At Evangel we've been having a number of funerals lately. It is hard to say earthly goodbye's to such dearly loved ones. But at each of the services, we have boldly proclaimed that because of Jesus' self-giving act of love, those who trust in Him do not die but begin an unending life. We will be proclaiming this and celebrating those in glory on All Saints' Day worship on Sun., Nov. 2.

The personal message that Bess waited for was a secret message. It was based on word combinations that corresponded to a secret spelling code. The Houdinis' secret phrase spelled out one word: "believe."

This Halloween-All-Saints' celebration, may we put our belief not in the abilities and powers of people, but in the powerful victory of our Lord Jesus. Yes, let us believe...but let us believe in what is sure and true. Let us believe in the Risen Lord, who has come back from the grave to demonstrate that indeed He is the Victor! When we do, our "last hope" will never be gone! And by the way, the light of Christ's shrine still burns brightly! We need no séance to talk with

Jesus. He is not dead, but alive. We can talk to Him any time, any place. Our "last hope" is never gone. He lives and reigns forever! Happy Halloween!

# From Rockelle Warner, Member of Evangel UMC

Dear Church Family,

I write this letter with deep gratitude and reverence for the love, support, and grace you have shown me and my children during one of the most difficult seasons of our lives.

There was a time when I woke up at three in the morning with sharp pains coursing through my body. I couldn't sit up, couldn't stand, and I was terrified. My body had frozen in a praying position, and I didn't know why. I didn't want to wake my children or let them see me in that state—knowing I was the only parent they had. That moment marked the beginning of years of chronic pain, surgeries, and uncertainty.



As the days passed, I realized I could no longer walk or work. Without income, my family faced the threat of homelessness and hunger. I cried out to God, asking why this was happening—especially after all we had already endured. But even in my pain, I thanked Him for His grace and provision. Though I couldn't see help at the time, I trusted that He hadn't forgotten me. His ways are not our ways, and I chose to wait on Him through tears and faith.

With no relatives nearby, my children became my caregivers, balancing school and home responsibilities. Our savings quickly ran out, and we faced eviction. Public assistance and disability benefits were denied. I had no one to call-but I still trusted God. I reminded Him of His Word, and He answered.

You, my church family, stepped in. You paid our rent and car payment. You brought food to our home. You reminded me that I was not alone. Even when doctors couldn't diagnose my condition, each month brought new financial breakthroughs. Though surgeries and infections followed, I never stopped praying, praising, and trusting God's timing.

After six surgeries, I could walk again and felt less pain. People from church–some I hadn't even met–became financial supporters of my family. Your kindness kept a roof over our heads, food on our table, and my children in school. Most of all, it allowed me to give back and help others.

I am deeply grateful to Christ Jesus for His healing and provision, and I will never forget the compassion and generosity of this church. You have been the hands and feet of Jesus in my life. I thank God for each of you, for my children, and for His favor over our lives.

My journey has not been easy, but I've learned that gratitude is essential—even in the hardest seasons. Praise moves God, and your love moved me.
