

### From Pastor David

#### Peace in Troubled Times

*"I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world."*  
- John 16:33

The tensions in our communities, especially here in MN (focused mainly in the Twin Cities and here in the Rochester area), accented by the two separate fatal shootings of protesters by federal agents, have sent us all reeling. The divisions that now seem to define our communities continue to entrench and grow stronger. Anger and rancor dominate so many public interactions. It feels so discouraging and seems overwhelming. Where is our hope as things seem to spiral out of control? Our church has sought to respond by again choosing The Jesus Way (this is described in a document of the same name on our church website). We commit, as individuals, to interact wherever we go with love and unrelenting grace. We love God. We love others. We live differently.

We have activated our "Serve as the hands and feet of Jesus" commitment by raising support (diapers, wipes, food, monies) for those with whom we have connections who are experiencing fear: The Good News Children's Center, The Hispanic Pentecostal Church & the Zumbro Ridge Estates. Thank you for the outpouring generosity of donations!

I want to encourage everyone during this troubling time that our hope comes from God, even when things go very wrong in our world and in our lives.

Seemingly irreconcilable hostilities, terrible happenings and deep pain do not mean God is inactive. They instead reveal the brokenness of people, and that actually our only hope lies with God. It feels like God rarely delivers us from problems. Instead He comes to us in them. Jesus was born at Christmas as "God with us." As one of us, Jesus knows the depth of depravity people are capable of and all the heartache we experience. Jesus also came to break us free from sin and make reconciliation possible. Our hope comes from our confidence that our God is here, that Jesus has broken the power of evil & that the Holy Spirit is at work to make possible what people cannot do. I also want to suggest some ways that our hopeful faith shapes how we engage our troubled world:

- Care with compassion. Don't just care about how you think things ought to be. In compassion see all people as God's beloved and reinforce that which respects and validates all people on all sides. Care enough to show compassion to those in your circle: how can you show respect for those who look and think very differently? And keep a lookout for—and share—what you see going on that "looks Jesus-y!"
- Be informed but do not become overwhelmed. It is important to stay informed, but know yourself and how you react. You are in control of what information you absorb. Do not engage our endless media coverage in a way that reinforces your selfish quest for drama or which begins to drag you into despair. Remember to balance good with bad. Notice what is going well and right. See ways that God is at work. Seek out what is beautiful.
- Practice self discipline to distinguish between righteous indignation and despairing anger. Godly anger rightly is offended by ways people are exploited and abused. Yet be wary of your anger slipping into being about you. This can be hard to distinguish. Godly anger pushes us to become active in doing constructive acts of love and seeking peace with justice. Selfish anger is controlled by our feelings and seeks to make us feel better by what we do. Only prayer will help us see the difference clearly.
- Keep the picture small. There is little we can do to fix the comprehensive scope of the bigger problems. The good news is that you don't have to! God is handling that! Instead, seek out micro-activities you can do to share hope. Listen—really listen!—to someone who looks or thinks different(ly). Spend some time respectfully around folks from "the other side." Invite someone you normally wouldn't for coffee or a meal, just to connect as people. Seek to show Jesus to this in your sphere of influence. Guard your words: speak only that which helps others.

- Give from your situation of blessing. Most of us aren't fearful of deportation, although we are all fearful of being treated badly. Show love. Do nothing that shows disrespect to anyone. Speak hope. Relay what is uplifting and hopeful. Give. Give from your affluence to bless others struggling. Again, the ways I mentioned above are good options. Most importantly, pray. Pray for peace. Pray for calmer heads to prevail. Pray for wisdom for our leaders. Pray for federal agents to act compassionately. Pray for law enforcement to see all people as important. Pray for demonstrators to model peace. Pray for God to work among us what is impossible for us to do on our own.

We are not alone. God is with us. Jesus has overcome all the powers of this world. That is our hope. Come what may, we'll be okay, if we let God lead the way. We have so much to be hopeful about. We have the inner peace of Jesus, a peace not like the world gives. It is for such a time as this, that we have hope in Jesus to share!

## Collections Continue to Share Blessings and Hope

We are pleased to share that we ended the year with only a \$2,222 deficit. Deficit has been reduced from previous reporting due to:

- Others giving extra to minimize the projected deficit gap
- Some pre-paying 2026 giving (all or partial)
- Total expenses being lower than budgeted

## Connections and Growth: Safe Sanctuaries Handbook

In 2015, Pastor Jeff Utecht and Jim Klepper co-wrote Evangel’s Safe Sanctuaries Handbook. This document is designed to protect children, youth, vulnerable adults, and those who serve them by establishing clear policies to prevent misconduct of a sexual nature and to promote overall safety. The handbook includes theological and position statements, reporting procedures, safety protocols, and mandatory reporting guidelines.

The original Safe Sanctuaries Handbook has recently been revisited for updates. Pastor David and Jim Klepper completed the first round of revisions, followed by a second review and edit by Evangel staff. The document will now move into a final edit and formatting stage before being presented to the Evangel Staff-Parish Relations Committee for approval.

Once finalized and approved, Evangel staff will schedule live training sessions for all individuals who work with children, youth, and vulnerable adults, as well as for anyone else who wishes to participate. In addition, video-based training will be developed to support efficient and ongoing education.

Evangel is committed to being a safe and welcoming place for everyone.


