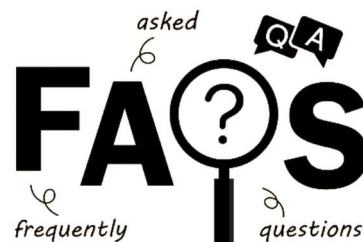

## Can we use our cell phones?

Students may bring their cell phones to camp. Upon arrival at camp, students will place their phones on a designated counter where they will stay during programming and overnight. Students may use their cell phone during free times, but should not be on their phone the entirety of free time.

## What are the housing accommodations?

## DRESS CODE GUIDELINES

All students are asked to dress in a respectful and modest way. The following is a helpful guide to define modest; however, Student Discipleship leaders will make the final decision regarding whether clothing is appropriate.

**Shorts:** All shorts must be finger-tip length.

**Skirts or Dresses:** Any skirts or dresses must cover the knee while standing.

**Shirts:** All shirts must have sleeves. Tank tops, spaghetti straps, ect may be worn when accompanied by another shirt. Shirts should cover the belly when arms are fully extended into the air.

**Swimsuits:** Girls may wear modest one-piece swimsuits accompanied by a dark shirt. Guys may wear any modest swimsuit shorts (no “brief-style” swimsuits) accompanied by a shirt.
