Camp Theme

Global Youth Camp 2018 is focused on Acts 1-12. Students will walk through the first twelve chapters of Acts in a way that will bring it to life. Global integrates its theme and Bible study into everything it does, including recreation, drama, worship, messages, quiet times, reflections, and more to help illustrate biblical truth.

Camp Teams

Camp is organized into teams, led by Global's summer staff of college students. Teams are randomly grouped in a mixture of youth groups, genders, and ages. Global does this on purpose. They believe that if youth groups are temporarily separated from each other at times throughout the camp day, they will be stronger when they come back together. The team aspect allows students to be taken out of their comfort zone of normal habits and routine within their youth group and circle of friends. Once out of their comfort zone, students can have the opportunity to be more open to what God has in store for them without distraction.

Every night at 10:00 pm, our students will gather together for an hour and debrief the day before heading off to rooms for the night. Students will have opportunities to share about their day and what God is doing in their lives through the Bible studies and team times.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Where will we be staying during travel?

We will be staying overnight on Sunday, July 8 at Poplar Heights Baptist Church in Jackson, TN (1980 Hollywood Dr.) as we travel to camp. As we return from camp we will stay at Criewood Baptist Church in Nashville, TN (480 Hogan Rd.) on Friday, July 13. Students should be prepared to sleep on the floor each of these nights.

Who are the adult sponsors?

The adult sponsors and their contact information will be in the final information form available July 1.

What are the rooming assignments?

Rooming assignments will not be made until after the final payment deadline and will be announced July 1 when the final camp information form is available.

Will we need money at camp?

There will be 5-6 fast food meals during travel students will be responsible to pay themselves (\leq \$6/meal). Your child will not need any money during camp, however there will be concessions and stores on campus.

What is the cell phone policy?

Students are allowed to bring their cell phones to camp, but must turn them into an adult when we arrive at camp. Student may use their cell phones to call home but the adults will keep the cell phone throughout the week.

**GLOBAL YOUTH MINISTRY
OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT
ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND RELEASE**

In consideration of the services of Global Youth Ministry, and Alpine Towers International, Inc, their agents, owners, officers, volunteers, participants, employees, and all other persons or entities acting in any capacity on their behalf (hereinafter collectively referred to as GYM/ATI), I hereby agree to release, indemnify, and discharge GYM/ATI, on behalf of myself, my children, my parents, my heirs, assigns, personal representative and estate as follows:

1. I acknowledge that my participation in ropes course, blob, hiking, paintball, and other outdoor activities entails known and unanticipated risks, which could result in physical or emotional injury, paralysis, death, or damage to myself, to property, or to third parties. I understand that such risks simply cannot be eliminated without jeopardizing the essential qualities of the activity.

GYM/ATI programs are based on the "challenge by choice" principle. At any time you and/or your group are free to withdraw from participation in any outdoor activities. The risks include, among other things, the potential for: slips, falls and falling, rope burns, pinches, scrapes, twists and jolts that could result in scratches, bruises, sprains, lacerations, fractures, concussions, or even more severe life threatening hazards. During and activity there may be contact with plants, animals, or insects that could create hazards such as stings, allergies, and associated diseases.

Furthermore, GYM/ATI instructors have difficult jobs to perform. They seek safety, but they are not infallible. They might be unaware of a participant's fitness or abilities, they might misjudge the weather.

2. I expressly agree and promise to accept and assume all of the risks existing in this activity. My participation in this activity is purely voluntary, and I elect to participate in spite of the risks.

3. I hereby voluntarily release, forever discharge, and agree to indemnify and hold harmless GYM/ATI from any and all claims, demands, or causes of action, which are in any way connected with my participation in this activity or my use of GYM/ATI equipment or facilities, including any such claims which allege negligent acts or omissions of GYM/ATI.

4. Should GYM/ATI or anyone acting on their behalf, be required to incur attorney's fees and costs to enforce this agreement, I agree to indemnify and hold them harmless for all such fees and costs.

5. I certify that I have adequate insurance to cover any injury or damage I may cause or suffer while participating, or else I agree to bear the costs of such injury or damage myself. I further certify that I am willing to assume the risk of any medical or physical condition I may have.

6. In the event that I file a lawsuit against GYM/ATI, I agree to do so solely in the state of Georgia, and I further agree that the substantive law of that state shall apply in that action without regard to the conflict of law rules of that state. I agree that if any portion of this agreement is found to be void or unenforceable, the remaining portions shall remain in full force and effect.

By signing this document, I acknowledge that if anyone is hurt or property is damaged during my participation in this activity, I may be found by a court of law to have waived my right to maintain a lawsuit against GYM/ATI on the basis of any claim from which I have released them herein.

WHITE WATER RAFTING ADVENTURE

At the conclusion of camp, we will raft the Ocoee River in Tennessee. We will be using Outland Expeditions for our outfitter and raft guides. The Ocoee River is one of the Top Ten Whitewater Rivers in the United States located in the beautiful hills of Tennessee. The rafting trip will cover 5.5 thrilling miles of near continuous Class III and Class IV rapids. The students will be given training before setting out on the river to ensure a fun and safe experience for all students. The raft trip will take approximately 3 hours and the cost is included in the price of camp. Students do not have to participate; however, all students are encouraged to take advantage of this unique adventure. All students should complete the Release Form (on reverse side) regardless of whether they intend to participate. If, for whatever reason, students wish not to participate, please notify Ed Willoughby by July 1.

Students will need to bring:

- **Shoes.** Students will need to wear shoes that stay on their your feet (i.e. not flip-flops). Students should also bring a pair of shoes they do not mind getting wet.
- **Clothing.** Students can bring any type of clothing that they do not mind getting wet. It is recommended for students to wear swimsuits or shorts with a t-shirt.
- **Sunscreen.** Students are recommended to bring SPF15 or better.
- **Towel(s).**
- **Dry Clothes & Shoes.** Students will need dry clothes to change into after rafting.

I fully understand and acknowledge that outdoor recreational activities have: (a) inherent risks, dangers and hazards and such exists in my use of white water rafting and/or climbing equipment and participation in such activities; (b) my participation in such activities and/or use of such equipment may result in injury or illness including, but not limited to bodily injury, disease, strains, fractures, partial and/or total paralysis, death or other ailments that could cause serious disability; (c) these risks and dangers may be caused by the negligence of the owners, employees, officers or agents of Outland Expeditions, Inc.; the negligence of the participants, the negligence of others, accidents, breaches of contract, the forces or nature or other causes. Risks and dangers may arise from foreseeable or unforeseeable causes including, but not limited to, guide decision making, including that a guide may misjudge terrain, weather, trail or river route location, and water level, risks of falling out of or drowning while in a raft, canoe or kayak and such other risks, hazards and dangers are integral to recreational activities that take place in a wilderness, outdoor or recreational environment; and (d) by my participation in these activities and/or use of equipment, I hereby assume all risks and dangers and all responsibility for any losses and/or damages, whether caused in whole or in part by the negligence or other conduct of the owners, agents, officers, or employees of Outland Expeditions, Inc., or by any other person.

I, on behalf of myself, my personal representatives and my heirs hereby voluntarily agree to release, waive, discharge, hold harmless, defend and indemnify Outland Expeditions, Inc. and its owners, agents, officers and employees from any and all claims, actions or losses for bodily injury, property damage, wrongful death, loss of services or otherwise which may arise out of my use of Outland Expeditions, Inc. equipment or my participation in white water rafting and/or climbing activities.
