

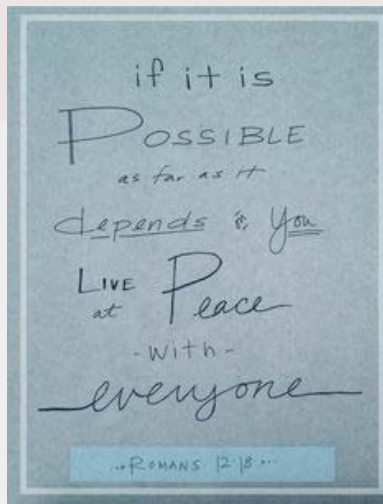

THE IMPORTANCE OF DEVELOPING A BIBLICAL VIEW OF RELATIONSHIPS

Research tells us that the majority of young adults live in unhealthy relationships. Not just romantic relationships, but also relationships with friends, peers, family, and those in authority. Research also tells us that relationship habits form largely by the age of 18. In other words, how a person relates to others when they are 18 will be how they relate with others for the rest of their lives. This is not to say that people cannot change, but change becomes increasingly more difficult.

If relationship habits are largely built during the teen years, then it is imperative to begin building healthy relationship habits during those teen years. Not only is it important to build those habits, but it is also important to build those habits on a solid foundation. In Matthew 7:24-27, Jesus tells the story of two houses. One house was built on a solid foundation; the other house was built without a solid foundation in mind. A storm hit



both houses and only the house built on the solid foundation was still standing. In verse 26, Jesus clues us in to the source of the solid foundation: His Word. When we build our lives on His Word then no matter the storm, we will be left standing.

This is just as true in our relationships. If we build our worldview of relationships, our relationship practices, and our relationships themselves on God's

Word then we never have to fear the inevitable storms that may come, whether they be attacks on our relationships with family, friends, or in romance.

This Spring in Midweek we are going to dive into what the Bible teaches us about relationships and how to relate to others. I hope you will join us as we look at our relationships with authorities, friends, family, and even in romance.

Glossary

apocalyptic. A literary genre concerned with coming judgment and salvation, usually presented with symbolism and imagery.

eschatology. The study of the end times.

millennium. A period of 1,000 years mentioned in Revelation 20:4-5 as a time of Christ's reign over believers on the earth.

revelation. From the Greek, *apokalypsis*, which means something once hidden now being revealed. The Book of Revelation is Christ revealing details about the great and terrible day of the Lord.

tribulation. A time of distress, suffering, and persecution. In eschatology, the tribulation is a period of 7 years of great persecution began and ruled over by the anti-Christ.

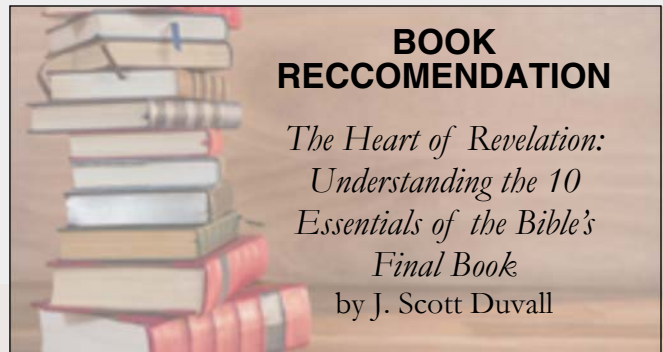
