Here are some highlights in our life & ministry in 2025:

## **The Word and Worship**

From the pulpit, we explored the vastness of God's sovereignty and the intimacy of His love through sermon series including *Alpha & Omega: The Beginning and the End*, *Our Desperate Need for Grace*, and *Identity Theft*. ### Sunday, February 23, 2025

The 342<sup>nd</sup> Annual Meeting of First Church of Christ – Bradford was held on Sunday, February 23, 2025 at 12:00 p.m. The meeting was held on Zoom and in person. The members were asked to be counted. Members counted off to ensure there was a quorum of 19 members, designated by our By-Laws. There were 23 members in attendance and the meeting proceeded.

The Warrant had been read prior in the Worship Service on that day by Susan Bergeron, Clerk. It was not re-read at the beginning of the meeting.

The meeting was called to order and a prayer for the Church and Annual Meeting was offered by Pastor Danny Ovalle.

A motion was duly made, seconded, and unanimously voted to elect Scott Higgins as Moderator for the coming year of 2025.

The report of the Nominating Committee was then presented, motion was duly made, seconded, and unanimously voted to elect all the officers and committee members as presented in the Nominating Report to serve until our next Annual Meeting.

The reports of the Treasurer and Auditor were reviewed. Peter Mills made note that church revenue is down and, at this rate, the church is not sustainable. A motion was duly made, seconded, and unanimously voted to accept the two reports.

The reports of the Committees were then presented. A motion was duly made, seconded and unanimously voted to accept the reports.

Pastor Danny Ovalle presented the First Church of Christ – Bradford ministry vision for 2025. The three main ministry initiatives for 2025 were put forth –continued development of our Children’s Ministry, assisting a new church plant for Iglesia El Camino, and providing an Open House for those attending the Haverhill Farmer’s Market on Bradford Common. Use of the MPT (Ministry Planning Tool) was also discussed. A motion was duly made, seconded, and unanimously voted and approved to adjourn the 342<sup>nd</sup> Annual Meeting of First Church of Christ – Bradford.

- We served two Monday night meals at the Citizen Center, sending funds for the meals, bringing desserts and a group of our church family served the meals.

# REPORT OF THE PROPERTY TEAM

I would like to thank our property team Sue Bergeron, Joyce LaRosa, and Peter Mills.

The oven was repaired on the range and was used at Christmas breakfast. The heating system was updated with self bleeders that eliminated cold spots on the system. Boilers were serviced and pressure valves replaced. The occupation permit was approved after 5 separate inspections.

We acquired new volleyball equipment. The C3VB group using it seems to run a professional club. We had one mishap with the installation work, which caused some slight damage. That has been repaired and reinforced. We also added straps similar to the old system.

A new combination lock was installed on the back gym door, allowing a dedicated entrance exit for gym usage. Mike Fay had 3 productions in the gym this year.

The cell tower was updated in January. Old equipment was removed and replaced. This year will require maintenance and updating to the gym and building exterior.
