

Luke 23:50–24:12 – ‘Risen From The Dead, Just Like He Said’ - Follow Up Questions.

1. The women were so focused on the seemingly insurmountable circumstances in front of them that it overwhelmed their memory of what Jesus had told them must happen. **What are some of the thing in our current situation that dominate your thoughts and distract you from remembering what Jesus says?**
2. We may not be able to visit the tomb, we may never be visited by angels, but we have what Jesus said! The Spirit of God through Luke and Paul and others has given us the teaching of Jesus. The details of the new covenant, Christ’s plan for his church, and all of Jesus’ promises are recorded and revealed in the NT so we can know and recognize what he says!! **What are some basic habits that are needed for remembering what he says and listening to him today?** (note: Colossians 3:1-17, Romans 12:1-2, Hebrews 5:14, Ephesians 3:14-21)
3. What Jesus said, he continues to speak today. **Reflect on these promises of Jesus. Which ones do you need to pray for faith in today?**

- Anyone who humbly trusts in Jesus and his teaching is made right with God and welcomed into his kingdom. (Luke 18)
- We can expect to be rejected and insulted on account of our faith in Jesus — but we are also blessed (Luke 6: 22-23).
- Through faith in Jesus, God gives us the Holy Spirit, and Blessing is found in obedience to God’s word (Luke 11:13, 28).
- We have nothing to fear in death, for we are known and valued by the One who has power over our eternal destiny (Luke 12: 4-7).
- Greatness is found in being “the least”. and we are to give up our own lives for the sake of the gospel because in the gospel we have eternal life (Luke 9).
- If we stand publicly for Jesus today, he will stand and affirm us as his own on the final day (Luke 12: 8).
- We have no need to be anxious, for all the riches of God’s kingdom have been granted to us already (Luke 12: 32).
