A Note from Pastor Jeff

All around us are the signs of creation making its preparation for a new season. The leaves are turning beautiful yellows, reds, and oranges. Apples are ripe to be made into cider. The produce of our gardens are ready for their final harvest. The temperature is falling. Soon snow will cover the ground, and we will sit at the tables of the feasts of Thanksgiving and Christmas.

New seasons are not just part of nature; they are also a part of life. We, each of us, move from one season to another – from childhood to adulthood there are seasons in between and part of each stage of growth. There are seasons when we are "on top of our game," and seasons where we are not so much. There are seasons when we are passionate about one thing, and seasons when we are passionate about another.

The author of Ecclesiastes says nearly the same thing when he writes about "a time for everything." And what he is saying is that

there is a time for this until it is the time for that; and that each is beautiful in its own way.

What is true about creation and our lives is also true about a church. Congregations go through seasons – season of growth, seasons of fruitfulness, seasons of decline, seasons of searching, and so on. Most recently, COVID was a season for every church, as was adapting to the new reality after the COVID lock-down.

My sense is that we are "getting our traction back." That, the fruitfulness of our ministries reflects the fruitfulness of what they were prior to COVID. The use of our facilities matches their usage prior to COVID. I think we are ready for a new season.

Next year, it is my intention to lead the Leadership Board and our congregation in revisiting our mission and vision statements. Do we need to update them? Is God giving us a different vision for mission and ministry locally and globally. In addition, it is my sincere hope that God will give us a BFHAD – a Big Fat Hairy Audacious Dream; something we cannot accomplish without God's help. And I am excited about the possibilities!

As we move from one season to the next – autumn into winter, this season in our church to the next, it is vital that we pray for our congregation, and for God's clear vision for us. It is vital that we remain engaged with one another and with the process of discerning God's dream for us.

I am thrilled and humbled by what God has done this year in us, among us, and through us. I am excited by the possibilities for the future that God envisions for us.

Handbells rehearse Wednesdays from 7:00 - 8:30 PM and rings the forth Sunday of each month at the 9:30 worship service.


Wind Ensemble rehearses, Tuesdays from 7:30-9:00 PM and plays the third Sunday of each month at the 9:30 worship service.

Empathy Tips from Your Stephen Ministry

The hustle and bustle of the holidays and the short days of winter can be especially difficult for many people. How might we better love our neighbor, clerk, server, friend, sister, boss, etc.? One thing we can do to help each other is to use empathy (active listening skills) with someone who seems sad or stressed.

The definition for Empathy found in the book, "The Gift of Empathy," is; "Empathy is looking at the world from someone else's perspective to experience what the person is feeling (listening for their feelings)—and then expressing your understanding of those feelings to that person (e.g. "That sounds painful." or "I'm sorry—it's hard to deal with that." Or "I can see why you would feel that way.")." With two simple steps the other person can feel cared for, validated, affirmed, accepted and understood.

Food Pantry

Are you a little short at the end of the month after paying bills, or do you have a friend or family member who is? Did you know our food pantry can help? We can be a one-time help during a trying month, or a consistent help during job loss or any other difficult financial situation. We can set an appointment for you or a loved one to work with a volunteer, or you can drop in on Tuesdays 10am-4pm when FARR volunteers staff a walk-in pantry. Clients do NOT have to be screened or go through a financial review to get food. If you have a food need...we have food!!!

All with a food need in Fenton, Lake Fenton, Linden, Holly areas are currently welcome. We provide pantry type food, frozen meats and fresh produce (when available). We also have a personal care closet with shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste, and cleaning products. The Pantry also provides items for community food basket giveaways at Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter.

We are funded in several ways; church member donations, partnership with FARR, other civic organizations, and community members who have excess!! We also partner with the Food Bank of Eastern Michigan for reduced pricing on our staples.

The pantry also provides many volunteer opportunities! Our volunteers assist clients via appointment, and also help FARR staff the walk-in days when needed. We have a group that travels to the Food Bank of Eastern Michigan in Flint where we work in the warehouse to earn credits that we use to purchase food for our pantry!!

Our next large event is the Thanksgiving basket/box giveaway. The week of Thanksgiving, we partner with FARR and provide food for Thanksgiving dinner to over 150 local families. This is a community wide event and a special time. We will need volunteers Monday, November 24th and Tuesday November 25th to assist with the Thanksgiving food basket giveaway.

Seeds Project

Jesus said "Follow me and I will make you fishers of men". It has also been said that bringing people to God is often like planting seeds. When we talk to someone about our faith or when we are the hands and feet of Christ for someone, we are planters of seeds. We plant seeds, and give God opportunities to work in people's lives to bring them closer to him. The Seeds project applies these principles to inviting people to our church. The Leadership Board has been working to turn this planting seeds concept into an invitation culture in our church.

The Leadership Board would like to invite the entire church to be planters of seeds. We may have the best kept secret in Fenton. We are part of a church that is like no other. We live the methodist way of always growing closer to God. Each of us are on our own journey but with the rest of our church family. Come and plant the seeds of invitation so that all can find wholeness in Jesus Christ.

What are the seeds?

Our "seeds" are a thoughtfully designed system with words (Elevator Pitch), tools (gifts, yard signs, and an updated website). There is training designed to help each of us create our own personal elevator pitch.

Elevator Pitch

A seed is an elevator pitch. It starts out with a hook. Something that will get a person's attention. It has a body that supports the hook. The pitch ends with an invitation. It should take between 30 and 60 seconds to say. It is a conversation starter or sometimes just thought provoking. Talking to people and inviting them to our church takes a certain amount of boldness. Being bold is helped by being prepared. Below is our church elevator pitch.

Hook: A church with Heart in the Heart of Fenton.

Body: At Fenton United Methodist Church, we know that faith can be complicated and questions are welcome. In the Methodist tradition, we do our best to: do no harm; do good; and stay connected with God. Our pastor's messages explore God's love and teachings (from the gospel), challenging us to be more like Christ. We believe God's love is so expansive it is indescribable.

We are inclusive, so all are welcome. On Sundays, we have traditional worship at 9:30 AM and contemporary worship at 11:05 AM. The worship services are available both in-person and online. Reaching inward, we offer small groups, Bible studies, Stephen Ministry, Children's Ministry, infant and toddler care during both styles of worship, Youth Group, and Young Adults. Reaching outward, we have our food pantry, the elementary school mentoring program, a community garden, local community events, and so much more.

Wrap-up: Come as you are—there's no pressure, just an open invitation to grow and connect.

Seed Gift

A seed is a gift that you give someone. Once planted, it is present in their life and may remind them of the FUMC and the time you talked to them about our church. It can also be something that you might be seen with like a shopping bag with our seed gift logo or a pen with our tag line. Seeing the item may prompt someone to talk to you about your faith and our church. There are a number of seed gifts and we also have yard signs. Below is a list of the seed gifts, an image of the seed logo, and our tag line. They will be available in a tote each Sunday morning at each service. Please drop by the tote, Take what will work best for you as a seed to plant.



Seed Gifts: Reusable shopping bag, small/book bag, magnet, pen, and a business card. The business card has a place for a guest to fill out their name and contact information. When this is given to the church at a Sunday service, a \$5 donation will be made to our food pantry.

Updated Website

A seed is also an updated "I'm new here" website page. That has some examples of pastor messages or message series. An interested person can listen to experience how we are encouraged to grow closer to God.

How do I get involved?

Stop by one of the Seed Gift Totes located in the Narthex or Truran Hall and pick up some seed gifts that you see working for you either as a conversation starter or as a gift to give to someone else.

Create your own elevator pitch!

Create an elevator pitch that resonates with you. Our church pitch resonates with the Leadership Board. Elevator pitches are best if they are from your heart. We will be offering elevator pitch workshops over the next few weeks. The <u>workshop</u> is about 45 minutes long. During the <u>workshop</u> we will lead you through the process of creating your own elevator pitch.
