The children's stories were hard to hear, but the loving staff and wellestablished care for the children was encouraging. The fruit of healing was evident in the children's lives. Their joy, creativity, and playfulness were contagious!

I thank God for each team member. Each of them, gifted in many ways, were willing to serve and be obedient to the guidance of the Holy Spirit. It was so fun to see everyone engaged in different types of work; from painting, to teaching the Bible in challenging conditions. I was glad to see how the language barrier diminished day after day as deeper relationships were formed.

For me personally, a short conversation with little Joshua left a deep impression on my heart. While my husband and I were having a planning meeting in the center area of the RDR campus, Joshua, the youngest member of the RDR family, sat next to me and asked me to read a children's book about prayer that I placed on the table. As I started reading the book, "Children, Can You Hear Me," Joshua asked, "Did Jesus grow up without parents?" I continued reading, and then he asked, "Was Jesus poor?" I had never had a child ask these kinds of questions before. It challenged my approach on how to introduce Jesus to children who have suffered from abandonment and poverty. Thankfully, as we continued reading, Joshua saw a picture of Jesus in his heavenly kingdom with a child on his lap smiling at him. The picture captured Joshua's attention as he carefully observed it. As Joshua walked away, he said: "I like that picture, I want to dream about it tonight." Joshua left with a big smile while I was left in awe as I watched the evidence of God comforting and giving hope to this child's heart.

As you know, the OEPC family has been faithfully supporting missions for many years. I believe that our direct involvement in global missions enlarges our kingdom-minded Christian perspective, while challenging our faith and priorities. It's powerful when we witness the transformational power of the gospel in the lives of those who are suffering!
