Not long ago I was looking forward to spring, then summer came. Now autumn is just around the corner. Garden harvest has begun and field harvest is not far behind. I love spring, summer, and autumn, and the change of seasons between them. But winter – not so fond of it. But I begrudgingly accept they are all part of one package. In northern Indiana, at least, if you get any of the seasons, you get all four.

Thinking of summer, we just finished our annual family week on the farm — with siblings, in-laws, nephews, nieces, children and grandchildren — all working together on maintenance and upkeep projects that kept us busy and focused throughout a long week. But every year we take a half day for some fun and distraction. This year it was the Elkhart County 4-H Fair, starting in early afternoon and going for as long as your legs and feet could get you around, or until closing — whichever came first. (I left well before closing, so I could still walk to the car for a ride back to the farm, but I did have a fun time while it lasted.)

But I am getting ahead of the point I want to make. My ride to the fair was with our son, Kris, who has worked for United Parcel Service since high school, and is now planning to soon retire (we are going forward through life faster than I ever expected). Over the decades, Kris worked as a loader, driver, facilities manager, route planner, and about anything else that had to do with getting packages and people from one place to another. He is also a hiker and knows how to plan and chart a trail through the Grand Canyon or along the Appalachian Trail. Which is relevant in this way - he was driving when we got stuck in "fair traffic" (or was that just a train up there?), and we began wondering about trying the side roads for a different entrance to the fairgrounds. I asked what he thought from his years of experience as a route planner, driver, and hiker.

He had made this calculation before. It went like this:

- 1. The main road or trail is usually the best way to get there. That's why it's the main route. Most people do best using it.
- 2. If you take a detour off the main route, don't go far; that's how most people get lost. Stay on or close to the main road or trail if possible. (If the bridge is out it is better to take a detour rather than try to get your car or truck to swim across the river.)

3. If you must take a detour, do it, but keep it short and get back on the main route as soon as reasonably possible.

With all this in mind, we took a detour and got to the fair by a longer but quicker route, without stop- and-go traffic.

This whole experience got me thinking about our church. We have been on a transitional road for over three years now, and are beginning maneuvers to get back on the main route with a part-time called Minister of Word and Sacrament or Commissioned Pastor(s) leading our congregation. While we don't know the timeline, the prospect of change is coming surprisingly quickly as my "transitional route" is coming to a close. This brings some questions, concerns, and sadness (sadness at least for me and some others!?).

We all need to remember . . . this is another change of seasons. Seasons have changed often in the last 175 years. We have a Presbyterian Polity roadmap for transitions. If we stick to it we won't get lost. Let's continue our prayers for our Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) and for our next pastor(s) who God is already preparing. Let's look forward with excitement and anticipation, and not fear. When the Hebrew people were afraid, God's Word came through Prophet Isaiah (51:13a), "You have forgotten the Lord, your Maker, who stretched out the heavens and laid the foundation of the earth."

Our transitional change brings some sadness and uncertainty, but let's stick close to the time-tested way forward and remember the Lord, our Maker. This is a relatively small thing for the Almighty to get us through. The change of seasons has happened many times already, and has brought us three joyful years together.

PER CAPITA is an annual per member fee a congregation pays to their area Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly to support our denomination's work in mission, evangelism, education and administration. Through your per capital giving, which is over and above your yearly pledge, the Presbytery of Wabash Valley helps congregations with transitions and resources for programming and planning, cares for pastoral leaders and their families, helps prepare people for service as pastoral leaders, and provides funds for special projects or needs of our congregations. There is a designated amount per member. In 2023 the amount per member is \$42.90. In 2024, the amount per member will be \$43.62. There is a line item for Per Capita on the church's offering envelope. Per capita brochures, which explain where your dollars go, are on the table outside of the office.

It would be of immense help to this congregation and our operations budget to please pay your annual membership fee as soon as possible. There are some in our congregation for whom paying per capita is difficult. If you are able to contribute per capita for those who might not be able to pay, your generosity would be greatly appreciated. 
