Christmas Leads Beyond Our Imaginations

Let me know how these guiding values resonate with you. Or, better yet, join us on Monday, December 5, 2022 at 6:30 PM, for our next meeting, as we work at putting into words how we will walk the path the Christmas Star is shining light on for us.

May the light of Christmas shine brightly on each and all of us!
