### Looking Back

It has been a year of growth in a rich age and nationality demographic .  
It's such a joy to see 0-90s, singles, couples and families, children and young people,  
worshipping together in the flow of the Holy Spirit.  
We have seen more and more people join us on Sundays, coming repeatedly, wanting  
to explore the Christian faith, so much so that we embarked on a wonderful Alpha  
course, concluding with an impactful Holy Spirit Morning.  
As with the year before, we continued in faith to hold nearly bi-monthly baptismal  
services, baptising people on every occasion.  
It has been very humbling to see the church coming together supporting each other  
through sickness and loss. As a growing family, *'we rejoice with those who rejoice and  
mourn with those who mourn.'* Romans 12:15.  
On behalf of Hannah and George Walsh and the rest of my family, I'd like to thank  
everyone for their love and support, following the passing of our beautiful Henry Jude.

We have really been encouraging people to be part of a life group for a number of years.  
I really appreciate the service and dedication of our group leaders. It has been really  
encouraging to see our existing groups growing in attendance and participation this past  
year. Just one example : I'm part of a group of 15 guys and everyone has led group  
discussion and prayers across the year. Some for the first time ever, confidence has  
grown, and ministry released. Our conversations have been real, honest, down to earth  
and faith filled. I have heard this repeated in other groups also.  
During the year Helen Mancini commenced a midweek Life Group for Children and  
Leanne Piano and Sarah Astill for the Youth.

Over the last year a large amount of remedial repair, and decoration was undertaken in  
the main Church building. This included repair to the tower and new electrical installation  
due to flood damage. Repair to the foyer roof and flashing, repair to some flashing either  
side of the main church and plastering inside above the windows. This was followed by a  
complete repainting of the walls and ceiling over the summer.  
AND FINALLY after all these years, we saw the demolition of The Shed (Tin Tabernacle)  
in preparation for the New Community Building and Hall in its place.  
The plan, is to connect the new building to the brick Community Rooms and the Church,  
and then landscape the grounds and surrounds.

## Looking Forward

At a recent early morning Boiler Room Prayer, we felt impressed to read and pray over some verses from the Prophet Isaiah...

*'Sing, barren woman, who has never had a baby. Fill the air with song, you who've never experienced childbirth! You're ending up with far more children than all those childbearing women.' God says so! Clear lots of ground for your tents! Make your tents large. Spread out! Think big! Use plenty of rope, drive the tent pegs deep. You're going to need lots of elbow room for your growing family. You're going to take over whole nations; you're going to resettle abandoned cities. Don't be afraid - you're not going to be embarrassed. Don't hold back - you're not going to come up short. You'll forget all about the humiliations of your youth, and the indignities of being a widow will fade from memory.'*  
Isaiah 54:1-4 The Message

I remember sharing this passage some ten years ago, when we had our first planning submission and now it is close to fruition. I have said at the beginning of the year, it's a time of GROWTH, not just in buildings and people but in heart, faith and vision. This resonates for me with the phrase in the message, "think big".

The new facility will enable us to maximise the use of our site and improve the function and flow of ministry and service to the community. It will allow for fresh outreach and creativity, and aid us as we grow! We will share more details on our Vision Day/AFM.

This year our Elders come forward for a vote of affirmation (elders stand for a three year period), members will receive a voting slip. We are looking at inviting some people in the near future to join the elders meetings and if it seems right, introducing them for affirmation at next year's Vision/AFM.

In March, Toddler Time will be celebrating 35 years of serving the community. It's a wonderful Toddler and Baby group that continues to adapt over time. It meets Monday to Friday. There's probably not much like it in the local voluntary sector, that serves every day of the week, providing a safe excellent place for parents and care givers to come and meet others and where children can learn, develop and play.

Look out for our special celebration week, please pray and think about the possibility of you volunteering some of your time to serve in Toddlers. We are looking for people to chat and offer a listening ear during the sessions. As well as parents, we are seeing more and more grandparents accompanying the children.

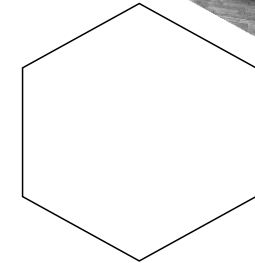
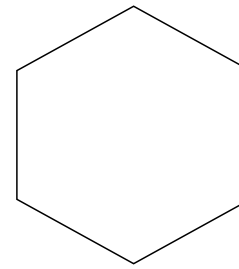

# LIFE GROUPS

***'Small groups aren't just a good idea, they're a God-idea!'***

Jesus gathered together His own small group of diverse, even challenging men that grew together and went on to become world changers. The early church was established as they met together in homes as well as the temple. Small groups make room to expand discipleship, extend compassion and exchange stories. I truly believe that **God does big things in small groups!**

We see our Life Groups as something more than a midweek meeting but a heart-beat for the church, with a focus on being **relational, devotional** and **missional**...to be authentic with each other and to pray into needs, ask questions, pastorally support one another, a place to raise up and release in and to reach out from.

Each term we share a new reading plan that will inspire and challenge through unpacking themes, characters or books in the Bible and we discuss how can apply lessons to our lives. Last year began by launching our *'Blessed'* reading plan, focussing on The Beatitudes. We have since covered *'Sacrifice & Salvation'* (Easter), *'After God's Own Heart'* (the life of King David), *'Reach Your World'* (evangelism), *'Advent'* (preparing our hearts at Christmas), and we have just begun our new reading plan – *'Every Step'*, discovering life lessons from Joshua!

Our Life Groups multiply the opportunities for us as a church to impact our locality with compassion and the gospel message. They have, over the course of the year, reached out to our community in lots of creative ways including giving out 100s of crème eggs, delivering invites and tracts, gifts to a local homeless accommodation and women's refuge, Christmas presents to Care Homes and Supported Housing, hampers and care packages, provision of hats and gloves...to name a few. They have also run invitational social events from wreath making to Scalextric Night, quizzes and crafts and meals.

We currently have ten life groups that meet on various days at various times and locations. They include mixed, Men's, Women's, daytime and evenings and kid's and youth life groups. We also have another two groups being planned in the very near future to help accommodate growth.

A huge thank you to our amazing Life Group Leaders – I value your time, support and heart to serve. *Let's continue to believe that God will do big things in small groups!* And I'm also thankful to the Life Group I'm part of – I know God is doing something amongst us as we share not only coffee and donuts but also our tears and laughter! If you aren't part of a Life Group, can I encourage you to consider joining one! Please feel free to speak to Adrian or myself about getting involved.

# INFUSION COFFEE HOUSE

We are about *more than coffee!*

We continue to be recognised and registered as a 'Safe Space' and a 'Warm Space', and offer food and drinks through our 'Pay It Forward' and 'Suspended Coffee' schemes, which are used daily. We have progressed to being zero food waste - if there is any leftover food we give it away at the end of a Friday to anyone in need.

We're still offering short-term work placements to young people from our local secondary schools and Erewash volunteer groups to help with vocational training. We currently have two young people with us who are brilliant and enthusiastic to learn!

The hospitality sector continues to be a challenging area with tighter food regulations and rising costs, all of which we constantly review. We had a surprise inspection from the Environmental Health Visitor this year and are pleased to say we received the highest possible rating with no room for improvement!

As well as continuing to be a space that hosts various in-house ministries and events throughout the year plus Time To Talk on a weekly basis, the space is regularly used for a number of external organisations, such as the Stroke Association and Erewash Voluntary Groups.

Our Coffee House is an asset to us and helps build a sense of community to those who visit... some may just want some time out and a quiet drink or to connect to the wifi to work, but there are many that come for friendship, conversation, support, encouragement and even prayer. We also have a great support network with some of the nearby businesses.

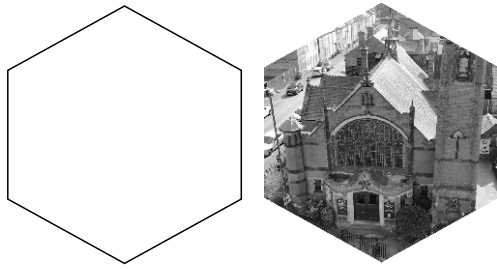
This year, from money awarded through a grant, we had some new signage that reads *'serving quality coffee since 2004'* – it's amazing to think that it's almost 22 years since we started with so many that have helped serve over those years and countless people impacted in our community. Some of those original customers still come in and new connections are being built too!

I thank God for His faithfulness to us and am thankful for those who have been and are a part of the Infusion team.

# FINANCE



Once again, a heartfelt thank you for your consistent and generous giving throughout the past year, including significant giving to the Building Fund. However, the past year and the next year present us with significant challenges.

As you will have seen, 'The Shed' has been removed in preparation for the new building and substantial repairs have been carried out to the roof and to the electrical equipment damaged when the spire roof leaked! You will all have seen an increase in your utility bills and the church has not been immune. Changes in the national minimum wage and the general cost of living have made a necessary and appropriate increase in the salaries paid by the church.

Unfortunately, while spending for the year ending 30th September 2025 (including wages, demolition and repairs) increased some 25% to £223,846.12, income for the same period only rose by approximately 2% to £203,266.50.

As of 1st January this year, the church current account stood at £36,352.68 which is a little below what is appropriate for our turnover. Fortunately, for some of the major structural expenses, we have been able to draw on the historically generous giving to the Building Fund which stood at £176,378.95 at the start of the year.

The loss of the Long Eaton branch of NatWest last March was not as much of a problem as expected. The use of our Post Office has required certain changes, but the staff have been immensely helpful and friendly. Joyce Sims, Jonathan Swift and Julia Ayling from Derby City Church have also provided essential support.

If you pay regular UK income tax, please speak to me about the Gift Aid Scheme. This allows the church to benefit from that tax at no extra cost to you. So, whether you give regularly, occasionally or want to make a one-off gift, we can very simply increase the value of your gift by 25%. Please see me.

# TODDLER TIME



The ongoing vision of Oasis Toddler Time is:

- **To create a safe, happy and healthy environment for children, their parents and carers to flourish**
- **To provide a high standard of Early Years Toddler provision in the local community**
- **To become a centre of excellence where the love of God is shown in a practical way**

The number of families attending Toddler Time each week is usually over a hundred. We are still providing a session every weekday and a separate session for babies, on a Tuesday and Thursday morning. The baby sessions have been very popular over the year and especially since the summer.

At the beginning of the year, we had to close because there wasn't any electric or heating in the church building. When we did open, we just provided one session and we have kept to just doing one longer session each morning.

Dave, Sally and I spent a lot of time over the spring and summer sorting through toys and clearing The Shed.

We didn't do any summer sessions because the building was being renovated.

In December, we held the usual Christingle Service and the children dressed up and performed the nativity story. Several families now come to this service every year. We also showed an animation and focused on the Christmas story at every session during December.

Just over 200 children attended the Christmas parties over the week. Again, at the end of each party, we read a nativity story and gave every child a copy of the book.

The books were provided by The Book Bus. In January, a mum told me that her child had made them read the book at bedtime every night since!

Quite a few people who attend Toddler Time also came to other services at our church over the Christmas period and enjoyed them.

I really believe that there is a harvest at Toddler Time. There is a beautiful atmosphere over the place and we seem to be having good conversations with people during each week. A lot of friendships have been formed and people are really thankful for the service that the church provides and the personal touches that we try to do.

At the end of each session, I always like to thank and encourage each of the volunteers who help me because they do make a difference. Just being that welcoming smile is enough.

## CHILDREN
