My food is to do the will of the Father

I scream, you scream, we all scream for Ice cream. Ok, maybe we don't literally scream, but I often crave it. Ice cream is without a doubt my favorite dessert. Do you have a particular dessert or food you crave? Food is such an intricate part of our lives we gather to eat at mealtime, birth-day celebrations, or holidays. Food is often the center of our celebrations. Food not only provides the necessary strength and nutrients our bodies need, but it can also be both pleasurable and comforting.

Imagine craving God's will like we crave food. Jesus said in John 4:34, "...My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to accomplish his work." The Father's will was what nourished Jesus. His pleasure came from doing the Father's will. This attitude took humility because it called for Jesus to let go of what He may have wanted to do, like avoiding the cross. The same is true for us. Jesus says in Matthew 7:21, "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven." Doing the will of the Father is relevant for the Christian. We have a choice in life to either be committed to doing God's will because we have to, or because we want to. We are more likely to do His will consistently if it brings us pleasure. A changed attitude towards God's will can impact our attitude towards scripture, prayer, and obedience to Him. It could transform the way we live, think, and spend our time. No longer would the things which help us grow in Christ become a burden, but rather joyful tasks. Maybe this is what Jesus meant when He said, "His yoke is light." Because we all know we seek to do the things we enjoy.

The truth is, we don't struggle with our religious practices, such as reading our Bibles, prayer, or going to church, because we lack the time for them. The reason many of us struggle with those actions is often because we approach them as a duty. Examine your own heart, is it joy or duty that leads you to read your Bible, pray, go to church, etc.? Would you like to find yourself having more joy in doing God's will? Would you like to see your religious practices become less of a burden and more of a joy? If you want to change your attitude towards God's will begin by memorizing John 4:34. Memorize and pray that verse asking God to help change your attitude towards His will. Furthermore, recite John 4:34 several times a day seeking to **imbed** that verse in both your heart and mind. Finally, keep putting Bible reading and prayer into your routine, but begin that time by asking God to help you see His will the same as you view your favorite food. Learn to crave God's will like your favorite food and you will find yourself growing to be more like Jesus.

From The Elders:

Dear South Side.

As Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's Eve get closer and closer, we should be thinking about how we have benefited from the generosity of God and how we benefit from living in His Love and Grace. Are you thankful for the home, food, people, and love that you have in your life? So many around us do not have the benefits afforded to us as Children of God, leading to more and more requests for benevolence from the church and us, as individuals. Please be aware that there are a number of missions that South Side supports that provide benevolent help to individuals and families who are unable to sustain a minimal standard of living. God calls on us to help the widows, the orphans, and the poor. Please help as you are able.

Everyone is aware that we have been looking to have new entryway doors on the church, as well as the fact that we have a drainage issue at the parking lot and sidewalk at the entryway to the Fellowship Hall. Both of these projects are at the top of the priority list of capital projects for South Side. Based on the estimates from reputable companies and from the Solomon Foundation, both of these projects will cost approximately \$150,000.00 each for a total of \$300,000.00. We have approximately \$125,000.00 in our savings account. Based on our current program, mission, and maintenance expenditures and budget, as well as the weekly offerings, we are currently just meeting the expenses to keep these programs, missions, and maintenance on the building. With the current economic situation in the country and the current cost of living, we, the elders, are not comfortable asking everyone to increase their giving to the church. With the average attendance of 75 people per Sunday, we are just making the expenses, as previously stated. One of the other ways of increasing the church's income, is to increase the number of people attending. The job that Jesus gave each of us is in Matthew 28: 18-20, where we are told, "18 And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." Please pray that God will assist you in reaching out to others who are not connected with a church and give you the words and boldness to ask them to come to South Side and witness what God has done for you, your friends, your family, and your church family.

If you have any questions or concerns, please see one of the elders who will be glad to talk with you and listen to any suggestions you may have to offer.




Each box requires a \$10 shipping donation, and any help toward this need is deeply appreciated. If you feel led to give, your support will help ensure every box


Wednesday Sisters in Christ Bible Study
