Kevin's Korner

The Abiding Life

Jesus calls us to the abiding life, "Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me" (John 15:4). The command "Abide in Me" is given with a sense of urgency; make this your top priority! It's urgent because it's essential, like the need to breathe. It's essential for the branch to remain in the vine in order to receive it's needed nutrients. Separate the branch from the vine and it will begin to whither until it dies. Likewise, abiding in Him is essential if we are to live like Christ.

We abide in Christ when we remain true to His teachings (2 John 1:9). Those teachings include how we love one another, how we forgive one another, how we live a life of purity, how we handle our time, talents, and treasures, etc. Abiding in Him includes remaining true to His work of sanctifying us. It will mean standing against the "truths" and immorality of this world.

Abiding in Him is a command not easily obeyed. Am I willing to give up my Saturday afternoon to help mow someone's lawn? Am I willing to shut off the T.V. and go volunteer at a food pantry, a hospital, or elsewhere in my community? Will I do it with a willing heart or the rolling of my eyes? Will I give someone the shirt off my back and then gripe at them for taking it? An abiding life will impact not just what we do but also why we do it. The fruit of the abiding life is both a change in both action and attitude. It will lead to a life of serving joyfully (John 13:17) and with compassion. It fills us with compassion for those who are sick, needy, disabled, or those who have little to no voice in this world. It drives us into the world of the afflicted (James 1:27) in order to minister to them.

Jesus sat and ate with the "tax collectors and sinners" even though it cost him with the Pharisees (Matthew 9:9-13). Living an abiding life may lead to criticism from the "righteous". It isn't always easy or comfortable living this kind of life. Thank you is not always the reward we receive didn't Jesus heal ten lepers yet only one came too thank him? (Luke 17:11-19). In fact sometimes our reward will be betrayal and rejection (Luke 22:48; 23:21).

In these painful times, the temptation to forgo this life can be overwhelming. Being rooted (Colossians 2:6-7) in Him, emboldens us to continue living an abiding life knowing that His Heavenly reward awaits us (2 Corinthians 4:17).

This abiding life is part of the abundant life Jesus promised (John 10:10). His life was marked with joy, peace, and love. That fruit is ours when we abide in Christ. The key to Christ's abundant life is found in living the abiding life.

South Side Christian Church Calendar for Leadership Nominations and Selection

August 17, 2025	Nomination forms will be made available to the congregation to nominate any SSCC immersion baptized member of the congregation for an office of Deacon, Elder, or Trustee. Nomination forms may be submitted to any member of the Nominating Committee.		
August 24, 2025	Last day (12:00 PM, noon) for Nomination forms to be submitted to the Nominating Committee.		
August 31, 2025	Labor Day Weekend		
September 7, 2025	Elders receive the list of member candidates from the Nominating Committee. Elders vet candidates and inform nominees of the office for which they have been nominated.		
September 14, 2025 September 17, 2025	Deacon Class - nominated Deacons must attend this class, or be removed from the nominated list. Candidates will review SSCC's Belief Statements, verify their support of these be- liefs, and the role of Deacons in the church. Nominated deacons must inform the Elders of their intent to accept the office nomination, or decline the nomination.		
September 21, 2025	Final candidate list is published to the congregation.		
September 23, 2025	Any Scriptural objection to any nominated candidate must be submitted to the Elders by 5:00 PM.		
September 28. 2025	Congregational Meeting following Worship Services – nominated officer candidates are either affirmed or not affirmed by the congregation members present at the meeting and casting an "yea" or a "nay" ballot for each candidate.


Wednesday Sisters in Christ Bible Study
