#### Kevin's Korner

Do you boast about your weaknesses? Probably not, most of us associate weakness with failure. We display our strengths as badges of honor, but hide our weaknesses with crosses of shame. Yet, Paul chose to boast about his weakness in 2 Corinthians 12:9. He understood that faith strives to trust in God's strength and not ours. Our strength can become a roadblock to a greater faith because we can end up relying on our abilities rather than God's.

Moses was a leader who believed he was called by God to lead the Israelites out of Egypt. Initially, he killed an Egyptian believing his brothers would understand that God was delivering them through his hand (Acts 7:23-25). Yet, something went wrong and Moses had to flee for his life to live in exile for forty years in the desert. Then Moses had an encounter with God. God called and Moses resisted; he was scared. He was now a shepherd and seemed content to remain so. His fear offered up excuses as to why he wasn't the right man for the job: "Isn't there someone better qualified?" (Exodus 3:11); "I don't know enough."(Exodus 3:13); "What if they don't believe me?" (Exodus 4:1-2); and finally, "I don't have the ability to do what you are asking." (Exodus 4:10). Sound familiar?

Ultimately, Moses' excuses came down to one problem; fear. Fear was his weakness, and yet, this was what led him to trust in God. Deliverance came when Moses acted upon God's strength and not his own. Andrew Murray writes; "The Christian often tries to forget his weakness: God wants us to remember it, to feel it deeply. The Christian wants to conquer his weakness and to be freed from it: God wants us to rest and even rejoice in it. The Christian mourns over his weakness: Christ teaches His servant to say, "I take pleasure in infirmities; most gladly will I glory in my infirmities."

As Christians, we think that our weaknesses are a hindrance in the life and service of God; God tells us that it is the secret of strength and success. It is our weakness, heartily accepted and continually realized, that gives us our claim and access to the strength of Him who has said, "My strength is made perfect in weakness.

Read Exodus chapter 3 and you will note that God never once said to Moses; "I know you can handle this Moses," or "I believe in you Moses." Instead, God called Moses to rely on His strength; "The Lord said to him, "Who has made man's mouth? Or who makes him mute or deaf, or seeing or blind? Is it not I, the Lord? Now then go, and I, even I, will be with your mouth, and teach you what you are to say." (Exodus 4:10-12) In other words, God responds to Moses by saying this is about Me, not you.

God wants to increase our faith. In order to do so, He calls us to do things we cannot do without Him. Therefore, our reliance on Him increases, because "... God's power is perfected in weakness" (2 Corinthians 12:9). We don't have to trust in our ability, but rather God's ability to do great things through us.


#### Wednesday Sister in Christ Bible Study
