A WORD FROM THE PASTOR Are you ready to be resurrected?

The calendar tells us that Spring 2023 is upon us. However, just three days ago - on Sunday morning - as Mike and I got into our car to leave for church it began snowing. Did it make us doubt that Spring is really here? Perhaps! But, does it change the fact that Spring is coming? Not at all!

Part of God's plan for nature is that trees and flowers lie dormant, and many animals hibernate, during the cold, dark, and harsh days of winter. It is as if they are resting up to be rejuvenated, or resurrected, in preparation for all of the excitement and activity that comes with Spring. Trees bud, flowers bloom, birds lay their eggs, and animals give birth to their young. It is as if the whole world closes the door on the dark days of winter and all creation comes to life again.

We are currently in the fourth week of Lent – a time to test and renew our faith - as we prepare for Palm Sunday and Resurrection Sunday which are quickly approaching. During Spring, nature's beauty is everywhere giving us a distinct feeling of hope and optimism and a chance at a fresh start in life. This is very much the kind of feeling that the two disciples of Jesus must have felt when, as they approached Jerusalem, in Luke 19:30 Jesus said to them: "Go to the village ahead of you, and as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, "Why are you untying it?" say, 'The Lord needs it.'" So, in verses 35-38: they brought the colt to

Jesus, threw their cloaks on the colt and put Jesus on it. As he went along, people spread their cloaks on the road. When he came near the place where the road goes down to the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices for all the miracles they had seen: "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!" "Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!"

From this joyous celebration, the tide quickly turned as Judas agreed to betray Jesus, and after Jesus and His disciples had the Passover meal together and Jesus went to the Mount of Olives to pray, Jesus was arrested. And, just as with the season of winter, the cold, dark, and harsh days had now overtaken the disciples, and their rejoicing had turned to weeping, as their friend, their teacher, and their constant companion for the past three years was tried, convicted, and crucified. The disciples were afraid for their lives, they were confused, and now some doubted everything they had come to believe was true about Jesus – was He truly the Messiah? They thought Friday was the end but, Praise God, then came Sunday – the first Resurrection Sunday!

Just like the trees and the flowers that lie dormant during the winter, Jesus laid dormant in the tomb until the stone was rolled away, the light broke through, and death was defeated as the grave could hold Him no more! The crucified Jesus was now the resurrected Jesus – he was alive and it was spring once more. During the remaining days of the season of Lent may your lives come more into focus on Jesus – our resurrected King - and may your minds and hearts be resurrected as you seek to love and serve Him with a newfound excitement! Amen!

May you have a happy and blessed Resurrection Sunday!

At our March 5 meeting we talked about a HUGE picnic! During snack time I gave the children two

fish sticks and five small bits of bread. I then asked the children to divide the food evenly among themselves. We agreed that this small amount of food was hard to divide among many and enable everyone to be filled. How did Jesus do that! During Bible exploration the children sat on a picnic blanket to hear the story of Jesus using one boy's lunch of two fish and five bits of bread to feed 5000 people. We talked about ways we, too, can share what we have with others and God will use it to His good. Some of the kids brought their favorite foods. Those that did told us about what they like to eat.

Then we donated the food items to the food pantry. The kids finished the evening by making fish wind catchers.

On March 19 we talked about a time some children went to see Jesus. We discussed how we learn to love- from our parents and others who care about us. We also talked about how age is not important in God's work; God uses children to do God's work. During craft time the children made mirrors in a frame. The frame says "Jesus Loves (their name)". Then they decorated it as desired. Every time they look in their mirror they will be reminded that Jesus loves them by name.
