Greetings Grace Family,

Happy 2023! It seems like only yesterday we were celebrating Advent and now we find ourselves in the season of Lent. Lent was developed from Christian tradition and practice beginning in the early church. It is a period of fasting, prayer and penitence. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and traditionally ends on Maundy Thursday, the night of the Last Supper, before the crucifixion of Christ on Good Friday. Lent is about 40 days in length to commemorate the 40 days of prayer and fasting that Jesus did in the wilderness when beginning his ministry (Matthew 4:1-11; Mark 1:12-13; Luke 4:1-13).

Jesus often withdrew to be alone with the father, Lent offers us this same opportunity to step out of our busyness and be alone with ourselves and God, to reflect and allow the Holy Spirit to deeply form us from within. We get permission to hit the pause button, making room for contemplative activities like thinking, meditating, quietness, praying and/or reflecting on the goodness of Jesus and what he is leading us to become and do.

Lent is a season of following Christ's example from Luke 5:16, withdrawing to be by ourselves in quiet prayer and reflection and allowing the Holy Spirit to search our hearts and lead us to confession and repentance.

In psalm 46:1 God has promised that he is our refuge and strength, our present help in times of trouble and yet we neglect to "be still and let him guide us.

Jesus began his ministry in the wilderness with fasting and prayer and ended it alone with the Father in the Garden of Gethsemane the night before he was Crucified. We see from the very beginning of his ministry up until the end of his ministry Jesus was never out of rhythm in prayer, he would always find time to retreat and spend time with the father whether it be in the morning, mid-day or at night, he never became so to inundated with the outside world, that he lost sight of the healing presence within him; so much so, he declares in John 5:19 he only does what he sees his father doing. Jesus was so in tuned with God the father that he became a reflection of God, He was indeed God's hands and feet.

So, what about us? Do we allow ourselves time to be still, reflect, to pray and meditate on God's word? To hear and consult God about our lives and the affairs of our community at large. Do we give ourselves the opportunity to recharge, reboot and refuel? Or will we be like the foolish Virgins who when the bridegroom showed up, they were out trying to find oil, because they allowed their lamps to run out, so they missed the bridegroom when he arrived (Matthew 25:1-13).

God forbid, we be like those foolish virgins; therefore, let us embrace this Lenten season with a Kingdom mindset, an attitude of growth, a willingness to repent and be challenged, to be humble and teachable. Surrendering our will, and seeking the mind of Christ in every aspect of our lives.
