A LETTER FROM THE SR. PASTOR

Few holidays in our country really represent our faith well. This is unfortunate as we are foundationally a Christian nation. Nonetheless Mother's Day stands out among the litany of holidays. It is arguably among the most prestigious, finding meaning in all faiths and cultures. Despite the attack on womanhood, the value of a mother still rings true in our nation. Besides the birth and death of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, there is no date more sacred to me personally.

To be a mother is an exceedingly profound prospect. I think we take for granted what God has done in that respect. To be a life-giver, that is to nurture a life within yourself for 9 months, and then have the same pass through your body is no little miracle! But it doesn't stop there.
