


Children's Church

Due to the eclipse weekend activities, MaTT Club only met once in April. The parable we heard on April 21 was the Wheat and Tares.

During Game Time we did an activity in which Rosemary walked around with a tray full of items. I ask the kids to write down "what they see". After she left the room I asked them questions about Rosemary, rather than the items on the tray. I then told the kids that sometimes we're so focused on what we think we are supposed to be seeing that we completely miss something else. After that the kids divided pictures of flowers into 'bad' (weeds) and 'good' flowers. Some of the flowers totally fooled us.

And it's not our job to decide if a person is good or bad. Our job is to show love, kindness and respect to everyone. Fred Rogers, of Mr. Roger's Neighborhood, said "Have you ever noticed that the very same people who are bad sometimes are the very same people who are good sometimes?" We talked about how each of us has good characteristics but sometimes behave badly. I told the kids that I'm sure glad that God doesn't judge me on my bad days!

We brainstormed "weeds" in our lives that prevent us from behaving in ways that make our parents and God happy. The children wrote these on a weed picture and put it in their binder books.

During craft time the children wove paper strips into a placemat.
