



# June 30 Financial Report from Trinity

### Things to notice:

- 1 Year to Date Net Income is positive.
- Expenses are below budget numbers.
- 3 June Net Income was positive

**Extraordinary Financial Items this month:** Apple Stock: On 1/28/22 we placed a donation of apple stock on our books as income because we were experiencing monthly losses in net income. Because the Apple stock varied in value each month it made our operating income bounce up and down. Then when the apple stock lost 20% of its value in the last few months it made it look like the church was losing money. To prevent the variations in the value of the stock from misrepresenting the health of the church the variations in the stock price were moved from Operating Income to Other Income. This increased the June net income by \$3,463. Coreen Casey Estate: We were able to sell the stock from the Coreen Casey estate for \$13,671. Of this amount, \$11,671 was allocated to the General Fund, while \$2,000 was designated as seed funding for the Amigo en Cristo mission project. This increased the June net income by \$11,671.

### **Ride Dates and Route**

September 25-28, 2025

The team will ride from St. Anthony, ID, through scenic landscapes and supportive communities, arriving in Salt Lake City, UT after four powerful days on the road.



Dear Church Family and Friends,

SHIELD616 exists to provide lifesaving ballistic protection to first responders and to strengthen the bond between them and the communities they serve. While our first responders deserve top-tier rifle and handgun protection, many departments can't afford it due to limited budgets. Our mission is simple: Protect Our Protectors.

This September, our **TOUR de SHIELD616 Ride** will take 34 cyclists (19 first responders and 15 civilians) from St. Anthony, ID to Salt Lake City, UT, covering 318.1 miles over four days:

- Day 1: St. Anthony to Blackfoot 76.2 miles
- Day 2: Blackfoot to Preston 101 miles
- Day 3: Preston to Farr West 74.4 miles
- Day 4: Farr West to Sandy 66.5 miles

Our 2025 goal is to equip 11 agencies across Idaho and Utah with rifle-rated protection. We're raising \$247,000 to provide the following:

- Ashton PD (ID): 3 vests \$7,200
- St. Anthony PD (ID): 7 vests \$16,800
- Fremont County SO (ID): 23 vests \$55,200
- Rigby PD (ID): 3 vests \$7,200
- Spirit Lake PD (ID): 10 vests \$24,000
- South Jordan PD (UT): 3 vests + helmets -\$10,000
- Draper PD (UT): 3 vests + helmets \$10,000
- Taylorsville PD (UT): 12 vests \$31,800
- Herriman City PD (UT): 3 vests + helmets -\$10.000
- Unified PD (UT): 12 vests \$31,800
- Sandy City PD (UT): 15 rifle plate sets \$18,000
