

All day we gave out a total of 600 bead strands to create interaction with people attending the festival.


We have moved the July game night to the second Friday in July which is the 11th due to the first Friday being the 4th of July.

Fish is getting ready for the fall School Backpack program. They need our help in gathering supplies to fill the backpacks.

***MOST NEEDED ** SECOND MOST NEEDED

- ***Pencil boxes or zippered pencil pouches
- **Three ring notebook subject dividers with tabs (5-8 subjects)
- **Three ring notebook subject dividers with pockets (5-8 subjects)
- 3x5 lined index cards (pkg 100).
- **Small glue sticks
- Expo Dry Erase markers, black
- Yellow highlighters, (thin or thick)
- Scissors (K-grade 3-5 inch blunt tip; 4th grade; above 7-8 inch pointed)
- Pens Red, black, and/or blue
- Crayola Markers, 10 count, thin
- · Crayola Crayons, 24 count
- Small pencil sharpener with cover
- Crayola Markers, 10 count, thick
- Crayola Colored Pencils, 12 count
- ** * Crayola Watercolors, 8 count
- 4-ounce school glue
- ***Composition Books Wide or College Lined
- Spiral notebooks, 1 subject Wide or college lined
- ** 2 Pocket folders, paper or plastic
- ***3 ring notebooks, 2-3 inches wide, plain colors
- Loose leaf notebook paper, 150 or 300 count, wide or college lined

- Texas Instrument Scientific Calculator, model TI30xA or TI34

The school supply list is taken from the supply lists generated by teachers in School Districts #91 & 93 every academic year. Crayola brand is generally preferred as the markers, crayons, colored pencils, and watercolors are better quality and are longer lasting than other brands.

As of April 2025, the most needed items to restock our school supply stock are pencil boxes, zippered pencil pouches, watercolors, composition books both wide and college ruled, #2 pencils, 3 ring notebooks 2-3 inches, 3 ring notebook tabbed subject dividers with or without pockets, plastic or paper, 2 pocket folders either plastic or paper, and small glue sticks.

Any monetary donations to our program are used to purchase new backpacks, scientific calculators, headphones, and any other supplies we are short on.

FISH is a non-profit 50l(c)3 organization (EI #82-0305800). All donations are tax deductible. Cash or checks to FISH are always gratefully accepted. (IF donating by check, please note: FOR School Supplies on the check). We purchase in bulk at the lowest possible prices to better serve more students in need. (Our unofficial motto is: Never pay retail!)
