**Do not remember the former things
or consider the things of old.
I am about to do a new thing;
now it springs forth; do you not
perceive it? Isaiah 43:18-19.**

This past weekend the leadership of both churches met with Brian Shimer and Andrew Arthur, and me to look at what God is calling us to be and do in the future. Each church group had time separately with Brian and Andrew, from Genesis Christian Mediation, to deal with issues specific to their churches. On Saturday we all came together to learn more about the process of receiving new pastoral leadership.

The first big idea from this work that we shared was that the bishop and district superintendents now look at our churches as a circuit: the Idaho Falls circuit. Circuits of churches are a very old idea in the Methodist system. A circuit is a group of churches that shares a mission field (like the mission field of Idaho Falls) and which collaborate to provide the best United Methodist ministry in that mission field. When the bishop and district superintendents consider what pastoral leadership to send our way, they will be thinking of our two churches as a circuit and not as two separate churches. Circuits were very important in the early days of the Methodist movement since we didn't have enough pastors to support all the churches that were springing up. A pastor was called a circuit rider (because he rode a horse) and would tend to his circuit by riding from church to church. Some circuits were so large that the pastor only visited each church 4 times a year. That is how we developed the tradition of having communion only quarterly, back in the day. Those original circuit riders would be very envious of our little circuit of only two churches within 2 miles of each other!

What kind of pastoral leadership we receive will depend on what pastoral leadership needs we let district superintendent Karen know about. It is important to note that being a circuit means we still have two distinctive churches, so this is not the same as merging the churches. However, we will be collaborating and cooperating in more ways, and we may very well share a pastor (or pastors) in the future.

The second big idea we worked on was the need to develop two clear visions for our future, so that we could explain to DS Karen exactly what we felt God was calling us to be and do. The reality is the bishop and the district superintendents have a limited pool of candidate pastors and lots of churches that need new pastors. Anything we can do to communicate well our passion to follow God's leading into the future will help us rise to the top of the list of churches looking for new pastoral leadership. We worked in two groups, innovators and sustainers/saints, to begin to paint a picture of what ministry would look like in 4 years' time if we followed God's leading. We then discerned (mostly) three people who would write those visions, and the rest of the group will serve as reviewers of the vision statements. The three people working on the innovators' vision are Don Rohde, Ray Miles, and Cindy Mason. The three people working on the sustainers/saints vision are Melinda Ginosar, Jeannie Hughes, and Connie Dobson, with a fourth from Trinity to be named later. Bev Kemp and Tracy Gohr, our SPR chairs will oversee the whole process.

If you would like to share your own thoughts about our future ministry, reach out to any of the folks listed above. They would gladly receive your wisdom. And please pray for the folks mentioned here. They have a large task in front of them and could use all the help they can get.

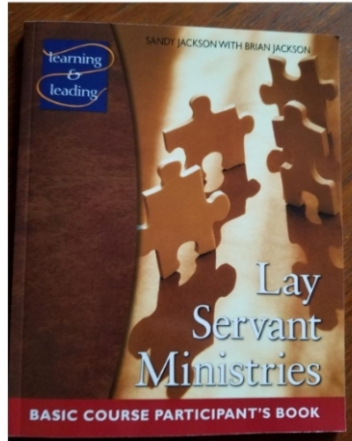
She sent a copy of the Lay Servant Ministries Catalog; a copy has been put on St. Paul's website, www.umcstpauls.com, on the Resources page.

In the first 10 pages, you will find all the information about becoming a Certified Lay Servant, Certified Lay speaker, and Certified Lay Minister (except what is expected by the Sage district committee on ministry). The catalog also includes lots of courses, many of which are available at <http://www.beadisciple.com>.

In addition, as courses become available via Zoom, I will be happy to notify you via email. The first course to take is the Basic Lay Servant Course. She anticipates this being available on Zoom in mid to late January. Each course is 10 hours in length, generally taught in five 2-hour blocks.

REMEMBERING CARL HAROLD COOPER



November 14, 1938 ~ November 5, 2023 (age 84)

Carl Harold Cooper was born on November 14, 1938, in Duncan, Oklahoma to Carl and Norma Jean (Johnson) Cooper. He passed away on November 5, 2023, with his children by his side, just shy of his 85th birthday.

After graduating from Lawton High School in 1956, Carl attended the University of Oklahoma (Go Sooners!) where he was a member of the Delta Upsilon fraternity and received degrees in Engineering and Nuclear Physics. He also met Joyce Page while at the University of Oklahoma and on April 1, 1961, they were married. After college in 1963, Carl and Joyce moved to Idaho Falls and he started his long career at the Idaho National Laboratory where he formed many life-long friendships. While working, he also received an MBA from the University of Idaho. Carl only intended on staying in Idaho a short time, but quickly fell in love with her beauty and the plethora of outdoor opportunities and of those, fishing was his passion. Ultimately he became an avid and accomplished fly fisherman and fished many of the famous and historic rivers and streams of Idaho, Wyoming, and Montana. Over the years he also refined his skills at tying flies and was an active member of Trout Unlimited and Fly Fishing Federation.

After retiring from the Idaho National Lab in early 1995, Carl and Joyce embarked on a phase of motorhome adventure and travel including trips to Baja Mexico among other destinations and spending many winters in Yuma, Arizona. While not in their motorhome, they spent time with friends and family, especially their beloved grandchildren. Carl was an active member of his church community and most recently was a long time parishioner of St Paul's Methodist Church where he enjoyed the fellowship and support, particularly during the time he tirelessly took care of Joyce as she fought her battle with Alzheimer's. He was grateful to those that helped him, cared for him, and loved him.

Carl was known for his unique sense of humor and ended every conversation or interaction with a joke. His most recent favorite was: "How do angels greet each other in heaven?" "Halo". Now he's making friends, telling jokes, and saying "halo" to the other angels in heaven.

Carl is survived by his two children Kelly Cooper-Slayton (Todd Slayton) and Brently Cooper (Marybeth); four grandchildren - Marshelle (Trevor Bouten), Sara, Jessica and Jake; two great grandchildren - Vivian and Piper; his brother Gary Cooper (Debra); and his half-sister Leonda Lennon. He was preceded in death by his wife Joyce (Page) Cooper.
