PASTORAL CONNECTION

How to Talk with Your District Superintendent: Leadership Retreat Nov. 3-5

The United Methodist system for getting the right pastors to the right churches is a bit convoluted. To understand the system, we need to start with the fact that we are a connectional system, which means all our churches and pastors rely on each other to be the Body of Christ in the world. We trust that we are all working toward the growth of the Kingdom of God on earth. We've been this way (connected) since the time of John Wesley.

For this system to work, we need a lot of trust and a lot of communication between the leadership of each church and the district superintendent. We place our trust in our DS and the entire Cabinet (the bishop and all the DSs of the area) to discern, with the help of the Holy Spirit, what configuration of pastoral leadership will work best for our congregations and who might be the best pastor for each church. At the same time, the leadership of the church has a great responsibility to discern God's will for the church and commit to the vision we develop from this discernment.

To help us prepare for our responsibilities in this system we are going to be holding a leadership retreat from Friday to Sunday, Nov. 3-5. Brian Shimer and Andrew Arthur of Genesis Christian Mediation will be joining us as we practice discernment skills, develop our vision out of that discernment, and learn how to listen to and communicate well with our district superintendent Karen Hernandez.

We also need to learn to listen clearly to Karen as she explains to us the scope of her work as district superintendent to the churches of the Sage District. We are expecting a lot of pastoral changes in the district this year and DS Karen oversees them all.

We will be meeting on:

Friday, Nov. 3 from 6:30-8:30 pm, as separate church leadership groups at both churches

Saturday, Nov. 4 from 9 to 3 pm together at St. Paul's church and

Sunday, Nov. 5, from 4 to 6 pm, as separate church leadership groups at both churches.

Our "regular, elected leaders" have already received an invitation to this retreat, but if any of you feel called to help our churches with these next steps in planning our future, please send me an email (kneary@pnwumc.org) and I will be sure to send you an invitation as well. We could use all the help we can get!

CERTIFIED LAY MINISTRY


She sent a copy of the Lay Servant Ministries Catalog; a copy has been put on St. Paul's website, www.umcstpauls.com, on the Resources page.

In the first 10 pages, you will find all the information about becoming a Certified Lay Servant, Certified Lay speaker, and Certified Lay Minister (except what is expected by the Sage district committee on ministry). The catalog also includes lots of courses, many of which are available at http://www.beadisciple.com.

In addition, as courses become available via Zoom, I will be happy to notify you via email. The first course to take is the Basic Lay Servant Course. She anticipates this being available on Zoom in mid to late January. Each course is 10 hours in length, generally taught in five 2-hour blocks.

This is the gateway course for those who are called to be Certified Lay Servants, Lay Speakers, and Lay Ministers. And can also be part of a person's discipleship plan to acquaint you with their gifts, calling, and responsibilities as followers of Christ.

*Each participant must have a book and be fully engaged in all 5 sessions with audio and video capability active.

The Lay Ministries classes are being offered in November. The classes are essential for the development of leaders for both Methodist Churches in Idaho Falls. We will need members to step up for the future of our church. The classes are FREE! The only expense is the cost of the book, and your time. If you are interested in becoming a lay leader, you must start with the Lay Servant Basic Course. It is being offered on Tuesdays and Thursdays, January 23,25,30, + February 1 and 6, 2023, from 6 to 8pm PST. After this class, you will be eligible for the Spiritual Gifts, Methodist theology, Methodist Devotional life, and preaching class. These classes have blessed my life, and I am sure they will be a blessing to yours as well.


These laypersons are called to live out their own discipleship as servants in leadership through the ministries of leading, caring, and communicating.

The United Methodist Church has established three categories for laypersons in the area of lay servant ministries to develop, prepare, and engage principled Christian leaders for the mission of making disciples for the transformation of the world:

- Certified Lay Servant
- Certified Lay Speaker
- · Certified Lay Minister

Certified lay servants who wish to develop their skills further may choose a track to become certified as lay speakers (those who are called specifically to pulpit supply) or as lay ministers (those who are called to long-term, intentional ministry as part of a ministry team).

Certified Lay Servant

A certified lay servant serves the local church or charge (and/or beyond) and:

- provides program leadership, assistance and support.
- leads meetings for prayer, training, study, and discussion.
- conducts, or assists in conducting, services of worship, preaches the Word, or gives addresses
- provides congregational and community leadership and fosters caring ministries.
- assists in the distribution of the elements of Holy Communion.
- teaches the Scriptures, doctrine, organization, and ministries of The United Methodist Church

Certified Lay Speaker

A certified lay speaker serves by preaching the Word when requested by the pastor, district superintendent, or committee on lay servant ministries in accordance and compliance with ¶341.1 of The Book of Discipline.

The role of a certified lay speaker is a specific calling for the ministry of pulpit supply.

Certified Lay Minister

A certified lay minister serves as part of a ministry team with the supervision and support of a clergyperson and:

- conducts public worship.
- cares for the congregation.
- develops new faith communities.
- preaches the Word.
- · leads small groups.
- · establishes outreach ministries.
- serves as a class leader.
- · assists in program leadership.
- engages in specialized ministries after appropriate training such as in parish nursing, church planting, men's ministry, children's faith formation, congregational care, and more.

WEEKLY PRAYER GROUP


Come and join St. Paul's weekly prayer group at 12:30 pm on Wednesdays in the parlor.

John Wesley was an activist working to alleviate human suffering, but he was also a person of prayer. It's no wonder why. Prayer, Wesley said, "is the grand means of drawing near to God" it is "the breath of our spiritual life" he said.

While petition and intercession are forms of prayer, they are not the whole. The focus of prayer is not on our requests, but on God. Prayer is how we remain in communication with God and grow in our relationship with God. In his sermon "The Wilderness State" Wesley says that "neglect of private prayer" is the most common reason people lose their faith.

The Community Food Basket served 1,195 families which included 2.784 adults. 1.195 kids, 271 Seniors, 40 Homeless, 184 babies. 4,600 diapers and 33 patrons requesting Feminine Hygiene Items.

Fish is winding down and distributed 574 backpacks of school supplies. The next project is the Homeless Stand down on November 4. Items needed are coats, socks, small bottles of shampoo, conditioner, soap, tooth paste, etc. Items can be dropped off at the Humanitarian Center.
