No, you won't be experiencing déjà vu later when you hear the gospel reading. Yes, it's the same as last weekend, but from a different translation of the Bible called, "The Message." All month long we're looking at this temptation in the wilderness story of Jesus that followed immediately after his baptism as we continue in our sermon series, "Tempted!" This week we get into the first empty promise of the devil presented to Jesus, that of providing for one's self. He tempts Jesus to turn stones into bread to fill his hungry stomach after many days of fasting and prayer. Jesus sees deeper than this simple thing to take care of his hunger; he sees how the devil is leading him away from depending upon God's provision in his life and to take care of things on his own. The brother of Jesus, James, will later say that "every good and generous gift comes from our father in heaven" (James 1:17). At PMLC, we believe a follower of Jesus is **grateful for God's good gifts**. What good gifts has God given you in your life? How can you say "thank you" to God and depend upon God's provision always?
