

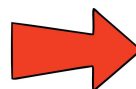
# **DECEMBER 2025 SHARING TREE LOMPOC FOOD PANTRY**

**Our local Food Pantry serves over 12,000 individuals in the Lompoc and Santa Ynez Valley and follows federal guidelines. Besides helping to provide food for those clients most in need, the Food Pantry, can also provide rental assistance, referrals, and help with utility bills. Requests for assistance over the past year include not only food, but, rental assistance, utility bills, diapers, and baby food. Our local Food Pantry faces challenges all the time and find a way to meet those challenges. The holidays is a time when they need additional help to meet the demands especially now because of funding issues and the recent government shutdown.**

**While the Food Pantry does get help from public sources, it also relies heavily on the donations that are made by corporations, churches, and individuals. Without this additional support they would not be able to help as many families as they do.**
