Five Keys for the Effective Sunday School Class in Changing Times

- 1. Centered in God (prayer)
- 2. Caring enough to give every student a job to do
- 3. Connecting in fellowship
- 4. Committed to follow-up (within 24 hours of an absence)
- Communicating on a regular basis via weekly newsletter (written or email)

Top Ten Indicators of a Healthy Sunday School

- 1. Systematic Bible Study (2 Timothy 2:15)—involves every age group of the local church in systematic Bible study
- 2. Spiritual Formation (Ephesians 4:14)—builds and nurtures the body
- Outreach/Evangelism (Matthew 28:19-20)—equips for works of service and soulwinning
- 4. Leadership Training (2 Timothy 2:2)—provides ongoing training for teachers and leaders
- 5. *Member Involvement* (Acts 2:44-47)—fosters opportunity for relationship building and fellowship
- 6. Learning Environment (Matthew 13)—facilitates a God-centered setting for the teaching-learning experience
- Teaching Aids and Resources (2 Timothy 3:16- 17)—utilizes relevant curriculum supported with appropriate teaching aids and resources
- 8. Family Ministry (Deuteronomy 5; 6)—strengthens marriages, equips parents, enriches family life
- Assimilation/Follow-Up (Ephesians 4:16)—extends care to prospects and integrates them into the church family
- Structured for Growth (John 15:8)—reproduces itself through new classes and new churches

5 Keys for Growth in the Purpose-driven Sunday School Class

- Centered in God (prayer)
- 2. Caring enough to involve students. Give everybody a job to do.
- 3. Connecting in fellowship
- 4. Communicating on a regular basis (weekly newsletter). "They don't care how much you know until they know how much you care."
- 5. Committed to follow-up

- 1. Evangelism of unbelievers
- 2. Systematic Bible study
- 3. Effective teaching and Bible exploration
- 4. Fellowship
- 5. Care and unconditional love
