#### A Message from... Aaron Bobo, Assoc. Pastor

Happy fall church family! I wanted to take a moment today to speak to you about a driving force (passion) that motivates what we do as pastors here at Smyrna. There are many ways to evaluate or quantify the health of a church. Some folks do so merely by looking at numbers, if a church is growing they are healthy, if a church is plateaued or in decline they are unhealthy. Others look at the number of programs a church offers. Some evaluate a church's health based on facilities or number of community events/outreach opportunities. While all of those things might be helpful, church health cannot be measured solely by any one of these metrics. Church growth can be either good or bad, after all several "churches" are growing even in our own community that do not preach the gospel. Church programs are wonderful but often the same core group of people are the ones running all of them! This leads to inevitable burnout and often very little in the way of return. The bottom line is that church health really should be measured by obedience which produces spiritual fruit.

Our desire at Smyrna is not to grow numerically for the sake of growth, its to grow in our walk with the Lord as we work together to serve Him for His glory with the gifts He has given us! We desire for our people to love God and we believe an outworking of that is leading others to love Him too! This leads me to the point of my writing this month, our efforts, goals and programs should be aimed at this purpose of spiritual depth which does often produce numeric growth but always produces spiritual fruit!


So, establishing this as the goal, how do we get there? Well I think Ephesians 4:11-12 helps us as pastors understand our role in promoting healthy church growth. Paul informs us there that God gave pastors and teachers (among others) to the church for the purpose of equipping the saints for the work of ministry. This means that the job of the pastor or teacher is not to do everything himself instead it is to work to equip the entire body to engage in fulfilling the Great Commission call of making disciples collectively! 

#### A Message from...the Worship Ministry. . . .



Just today I arrived home from the Sing! Music Conference. There isn't enough space in this article to share all I experienced this past week! First of all I am grateful for the opportunity to participate! The conference was attended by more than 4,500 people from all over the globe. I sang in a choir of 200, also from all over the globe. There were speakers

from various countries as well. The entire focus of the conference was to emphasize the

importance of congregational singing. On the last morning there was an international panel of Pastors from Ireland, Ghana, Dominican Republic, Zambia and India discussing the importance of singing in corporate worship

and how that looks in their churches. This is something that has always been close to my heart, singing praises to the Most High God the Lord of all Creation, with my fellow believers. Our congregations over the years have gone from participatory to spectators when it comes to singing corporately. This is a matter of such importance that many theologians and musicians have come together to begin a dialogue to encourage and equip church leadership to shift our congregations back into being participatory in singing biblical truths with sound theology in the songs used in corporate, private and family worship. Scripture actually commands us to sing. Paul told the members of the church in Ephesus to be "speaking to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit". He wanted them to "sing and make music from your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ". (Eph. 5:19-20). Paul doesn't tell us to perform for one another, but to sing to one another. Colossians 3:16 states, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God."

All of our Worship Ministry staff and volunteers are not on the platform to sing for you. Our purpose is to sing to and about the Lord and lead you to do the same. Here are some points to think about from Keith & Krystyn Getty's book "Sing, How Worship Transforms Your Life, Family and Church":


- Singing Takes Sunday's Truths into Monday.
   Singing files away the messages the lyrics convey in our minds and hearts.
   Songs help us remember scripture.
- 2. Singing sustains you in every season of life.
- 3. Singing reminds you of what God has done in your life.
- 4. Singing keeps your mind on eternity.

Much more could be said and read (I highly recommend you reading the above mentioned book...I read it in a couple of hours). It's my prayer that in addition to being a Bible reading and praying church, we also become a singing church!






