PASTOR'S CORNER

This past Sunday (August 24th), we had the joy of baptizing 24 individuals in the river. Leading up to that glorious occasion, Pastor Robert and I had the joy of meeting with each individual who was a candidate for baptism. There are numerous reasons for these preliminary meetings, one of which is our desire for people to properly understand their calling as Christians does not begin and end with getting wet!

Each individual is different, but there are certain messages that are repeated to every candidate and one of those messages is that baptism is not the finish line for the Christian life. In reality, baptism is just the beginning of the call to follow Christ and that lifetime journey must be followed if baptism is really a declaration of saving faith!

Folks, Christians should be constantly growing and maturing. After all we will never be done growing in sanctification this side of heaven! There will always be things to improve upon (with the Spirit's power) and things to know (by the Spirit's tutelage). This being so, I want to remind you today of one of the motivations for your growth.

I am often concerned with the perspective of many believers precisely because it seems so self-centered. For instance, I have had numerous Christians tell me that they do not desire to grow in their knowledge because they know Christ and that is enough to get them where they are going! While that short-sighted view has severe personal consequences, it also loses sight of one of the primary ways we have been called to help others. Think about this for a moment church, what if the knowledge you acquire isn't simply for your own benefit but for the blessing and wellbeing of those you love?

Consider a doctor who decides that he knows enough to pass medical school and, therefore, has no need to grow in his knowledge of the human body and what ails mankind. He may well reason that he is equipped enough to make money and, therefore, has no need to further his competency but this neglects the very people he is called to help! A doctor doesn't grow simply for his own benefit, he grows in his understanding so that he can assist others in need. In the same way, Christian, your call to biblical understanding is not simply about your getting into heaven or personal benefits, it is just as much about those you might be able to help.

What if those you love come to you with an earnest question or in need of guidance in the future? Are you growing today so that you can assist them tomorrow? What if the Lord puts a co-worker or neighbor in your life who needs the Gospel? Are you maturing in your understanding so that you can share life-saving news? If not, I would encourage you to consider those around you, particularly those you love, and let them be further motivation to press in and study.

A MESSAGE FROM ROBERT ROWLAND, EXECUTIVE PASTOR OF CARE

Dear Smyrna Family,

Can you believe that we just baptized 24 more people in the Nottoway River, and we have at least 5 more for this month? There are signs of life all over our church family. We had the privilege and responsibility of sitting with a large number of these folks to talk about what it truly means to be "saved" and the fact that we need to be saved because we are in very real trouble. Often when I ask a person why they want to be "saved", they don't know. They simply know they should be, they need to be, and that they want to go to heaven. Here is an important fact: until a person comes to surrender his or her life and will to the Lordship of Jesus Christ, the wrath of God remains upon them because of their sin and unbelief (John 3:36b). This is why you need to be saved dear ones. The devil and your sin are issues, but the real problem is that God's wrath is directed at you, justly so, because of your rebellion against Him.

We tried hard to make sure each person understood that baptism added nothing to the all-sufficient work of Jesus Christ on the cross, and that getting baptized was not the end of their need for obedience to the Lord. I have unfortunately witnessed people who must have thought getting baptized was like getting their ticket punched to heaven or acquiring some type of insurance policy against hell. Some act like getting baptized is the equivalent of getting the golden ticket that gets you into Willie Wonka's Chocolate Factory. It is not!

Brothers and sisters, whether it is baptism, reading the Bible through, or any other step you take, achievement you make, or commitment you keep, please develop the mindset that you will never reach a point where you could say, "That is enough. I have arrived and have all of Jesus that I want or need." I most definitely want you to be confident in your salvation. I want you to know beyond doubt that you are truly saved and going to heaven. We should know this and find peace in it. I want you to know and hold firm to the doctrines that are dear to our faith. At the same time, I want you to know that God, His Character, His nature, and His Word are infinite, and you will never arrive at knowing it all.

It is so easy for us to act like those who disappear after baptism are so terrible, and yet in many ways, others behave as if they have reached the line sufficient for salvation and need to do no more as well. I invite you once again to jump in with both feet this fall as we study and serve together in ministries offered to us here at the church. My hope is that we would all say with Paul, "Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me His own...I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus" (Phil. 3:12,14). Beloved, I am so thankful for all of the spiritual and numerical growth that we are experiencing in our church family. I know there is so much

more that we can come to experience and to know as we excel still more in every area of obedience to the Lord Jesus Christ. Join in as together we run with single-mindedness, determination, and perseverance so that we may obtain the imperishable gift the Father has for us (1 Cor. 9:24-27).

FROM THE DESK OF DANIEL WATSON, PASTORAL RESIDENT

Most recently I completed the book <u>Gospel-Centered Hermeneutics</u> by Graeme Goldsworthy. This work unpacks what hermeneutics is, the art and science of interpreting the Bible. It also surveys the landscape of interpretive methods and movements throughout church history. He warns of the dangers of having a poor hermeneutic and recounts some of the consequences that left their imprint on the history of interpretation. To have a Gospel-centered hermeneutic is to view Jesus as the ultimate focus of the Bible and faithfully interpret it through Him.

Goldsworthy powerfully states that a true understanding of the Bible must be based upon the person and work of Christ. His person means that Jesus is the divine Son of God, the second person of the Trinity, and is the One who took on human flesh. His work, in broad strokes, includes everything from the plan of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit in eternity past to save His people from their sins, and His actual work of accomplishing salvation. It moves on to His exalted state where He is seated at the right hand of the Father presently interceding for His people. It also includes His second coming and everything that entails. A key point that Goldsworthy is making is that the work of Christ not only guides the flow of the Old and New Testaments, not only provides individual salvation; His work is also directing the progression of history. All of reality only makes sense in light of Jesus. Goldsworthy puts it this way, "Gospelcentered hermeneutics is above all the endeavor to understand the meaning of any aspect of reality, including the Bible, in light of him who is the Light of the World."

As I am thinking over the ideas that Goldsworthy penned (this was a technical work that was a more difficult read for me) I think three passages of Scripture will be useful to form a good starting point to keep in mind as we approach the Bible. Acts 17:27-28 reminds us that we are dependent on God for our existence. Hebrews 1:1-4 shows that Jesus is the greatest and final revelation of who God is. Lastly, 2 Corinthians 10:5 instructs us to "take every thought captive to obey Christ". Remembering these few verses is just one way to position ourselves to develop, or strengthen, a Gospel-centered hermeneutic in order to see Jesus correctly as we encounter Him in the Scriptures.




