





Father Dave's Corner



Dear St. Margaret's Community,

The month of February is a time of transition in the church's liturgical year. As it begins, we are still in the season of Epiphany, with songs, lessons and prayers emphasizing a theme of Jesus as the light of the world. Then we enter the season of Lent: Forty days of reflection and preparation leading up to Palm Sunday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. Why forty? The Israelites wandered in the wilderness for forty years before entering the land God had promised them. Jesus spends forty days in the wilderness praying, fasting, and being tested by Satan before beginning his ministry. And in the early years of the Church new converts would prepare for their Easter baptism by forty days of prayer, penitence, and fasting. What these have in common is a story of transition and transformation. Lent is our reminder that profound change rarely happens in a sudden blaze of light. That may be the spark that starts the fire. But if we want it to continue burning we have to put time and effort into tending it.

During Lent we pay special attention to spiritual practices that sustain us day by day throughout the year. "Penitence" means facing into what we have done wrong, with regret but without despair or self-hate, and asking God's help in bringing about a change of heart and direction. "Fasting" usually means to abstain from food for a specified time for religious purposes. But it can also mean choosing to give up something that is part of our usual daily routine and devoting that time and energy to praying, reading scripture, or any other practice bringing us closer to God. None of this is about punishing ourselves. It's about shaking up the normal routines in order re-focus our attention on our daily walk with Jesus. When Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, let's remember that it is not primarily a season of regret. It is a season of renewal.





Rev. Janet's Corner

Dear Friends - In our bible study, *Grounds for Faith*, that meets on Tuesdays at 11:00, we are currently reading *A Wrinkle in Time* by Madeleine L'Engle. Considered a young adult novel, it is perhaps not a top go-to book for most adults who did not read the book in elementary or middle school. And yet, it is a delightful novel that tells a wonderful tale as it explores profound truths about intercessory prayer, light and shadow, good and evil, conformity and individuality, and love. Oh, and yes, there is a movie based on the book.



When I floated the idea of a book study connected with scripture, our group was very interested, but when they heard the title and realized the KIND of book they would be reading, they wondered how I could connect the plot to spirituality. Their friends and families also expressed doubt about the connections. But in our last session, the conversation centered on intercessory prayer which we explored as "standing in the gap." We studied a passage from Ezekiel (22:31) where God is pleading through Ezekiel to find someone to stand in the gap of the wall so that the city of Jerusalem is not destroyed. No one could be found and the walls fell, and the people of Judah were led off into exile in Babylon.

In the novel, Meg and Charles Wallace's dad, Mr. Murray, has disappeared. He has journeyed through time to the planet Camazotz where he is being held by an evil dark being. Because of Meg's deep love for her dad, she seeks him and finds him with the help of several celestial beings. It is that deep love that eventually saves The Murrays and brings them home. In scripture, God's deep love for his people allows them to return to their home, build up the walls of Jerusalem, construct a second Temple, and resume their worship in that Temple.

There are other connections. On the 10th, we will talk about the themes of light and dark. If this sounds interesting to you, come and see. The conversation, coffee, and treats are so worth it. We'll welcome you with open arms!

February Holy Days and the Liturgical Season after The Epiphany, followed by the Season of Lent


Liturgical holy days using white hangings are seasons and feasts of immense joy and triumph, symbolizing purity, glory, and the light of Christ. These colors are specifically used during the high seasons of Christmas and Easter, as well as on other major feasts that celebrate events in the life of Jesus, such as Advent, the Epiphany, and the Transfiguration.

The Liturgical "Season" after The Epiphany is Ordinary Time.



THE PRESENTATION OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST
IN THE TEMPLE - FEBRUARY 2 (WHITE)

Forty days after His birth, Mary and Joseph brought the infant Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem to fulfill the Mosaic requirements for ritual purification and the consecration of a firstborn son. While at the Temple, they encountered the devout Simeon and the prophetess Anna, both of whom recognized the child as the long-awaited Messiah and Savior of the world. Simeon famously proclaimed Jesus as a "light for revelation to the Gentiles" and the "glory of Israel," while also foretelling the future suffering of both the Child and His mother.



THE FEAST DAY OR ST. MATTHIAS THE APOSTLE
FEBRUARY 24 (RED)

The Feast of St. Matthias the Apostle commemorates the disciple chosen by the early Church to fill the vacancy left by Judas Iscariot, a selection made through the casting of lots as described in the Acts of the Apostles. While Anglicans maintain the traditional celebration on February 24, the Roman Catholic Church moved the feast to May 14 in 1969 to place it outside of Lent and closer to the Ascension. The day honors his unique calling as the only Apostle not chosen directly by Christ during His earthly ministry and celebrates his role as a faithful witness to the Resurrection.
