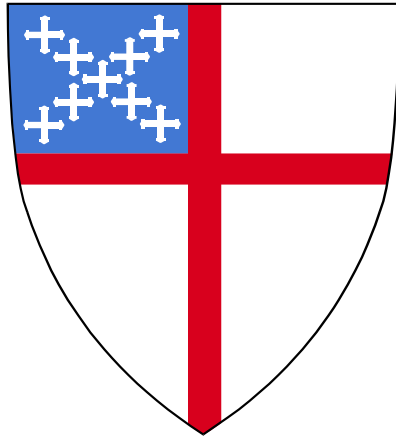

Father Dave's Corner



Dear St. Margaret's Community,

For most of May we will continue celebrating the Resurrection in what Church tradition calls the Great Fifty Days of Easter. Scripture lessons and the prayers during Easter worship challenge us to recognize the reality that the Resurrection is more than a one-time miraculous event that happened to one person a long time ago. It's more than a promise that we, too, can hope for resurrection when our earthly life is done. Easter season calls us to see the ways we participate in Christ's risen life here and now. When St. Paul says "Christ was raised from the dead...so we also might walk in newness of life (Romans 6:4)," he means newness that begins in *this* life. A new capacity for hope; a new strength for living in a world that's still afflicted by evil and death because we know neither evil nor death has final dominion over us. As Bible scholar Douglas Campbell has written, "Christians have already been resurrected." But for resurrection to become part of our daily life we need to experience it as something more than words on a page or an idea we carry in our heads. The reality of the risen Christ needs to stir us in heart, body and soul.

In the remaining weeks of Easter Season we are going to experiment with new ways of encountering the risen Christ in how we practice prayer and worship. Wednesday evenings in May we will be offering a Eucharist for Wholeness and Healing. It's a liturgy used by the Church of England that recognizes the restoration of *physical* wholeness is not the only way Christ meets our human need. Prayers for healing can also restore wholeness of mind and spirit by opening us to the work of the Holy Spirit in bringing the reality of Jesus' resurrection into our lives.

And on Thursday evenings beginning May 7th and continuing through June 11<sup>th</sup> we will be offering a class about the foundations of our Christian faith and our Episcopal way of worship. It's open to anyone who wants to learn more about what we believe, why we trust in it, and why we do what we do when we come together for worship. It will also provide the necessary preparation for anyone wanting to be baptized, confirmed, or received into the Episcopal Church when Bishop Richards visits St. Margaret's in August.

The Eucharist for Wholeness and Healing will be offered Wednesdays at 6pm. The Foundations class will be Thursdays at 7pm. Choose the offering speaks to your heart, and may it be a blessing.

May Feast Day and the Liturgical Seasons of Eastertide, Sunday of Pentecost, and Ordinary Time

Liturgical holy days using white hangings are seasons and feasts of immense joy and triumph, symbolizing purity, glory, and the light of Christ. These colors are specifically used during the high seasons of Christmas and Easter, as well as on other major feasts that celebrate events in the life of Jesus, such as Advent, the Epiphany, and the Transfiguration.

**THE FEAST DAY OF THE APOSTLES SAINT PHILIP AND SAINT JAMES  
MAY 1 (RED)**

St. Philip and St. James the Less are traditionally celebrated together in the liturgical calendar on May 1<sup>st</sup>, reflecting their shared importance among the twelve apostles. St. Philip, originally from Bethsaida, is often remembered for his direct role in recruiting Nathanael and for asking Jesus to "show us the Father" during the Last Supper. St. James the Less, often identified as the son of Alphaeus, is frequently distinguished from St. James the Greater by his name, which may refer to his younger age or shorter stature. James is widely regarded as a significant leader in the early church in Jerusalem and is traditionally credited with writing the Epistle of James. While Philip is believed to have preached in Greece and Asia Minor, James is celebrated for his steadfastness and eventual martyrdom in Jerusalem.

Continuing with more thoughts on the Holy Spirit:

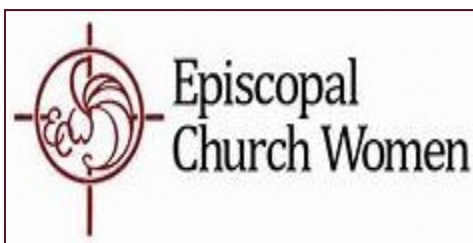
Pentecost, which we will celebrate on May 24<sup>th</sup>, is when The Church began!!! The disciples were huddled in the Upper Room – anxious and afraid – when a sudden wind blew into the room and tongues of fire were above each of their heads signifying the Holy Spirit was with them. They were all changed into the people that Jesus wanted them to be.



There are many names for the Holy Spirit – many years ago I remember saying “Holy Ghost.” More common names are Holy Breath of God (God “breathed” into Adam to give him life); Advocate or Paraclete; Consoler, especially during times of grief; Wild Goose – this is an old Celtic image. When you were Baptized and again when you were Confirmed, you received the Gifts of the Holy Spirit. But the Grace of those experiences goes dormant. That’s why in last month’s message I urged you to “Stir up” that Spirit within you.

As you look at the stained glass image of the Dove, another name for the Holy Spirit, share a smile with someone near you. Since it comes from within you, you may stir up that Spirit within you and them!!!

Liturgy Ministry - Brenna Bedenbaugh Altar Flowers - \$25 Eternity Candle - \$5

We are in the midst of Eastertide - the period of 50 days, spanning from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday. It is celebrated as a single joyful feast, called the "great Lord's Day". Each Sunday of the season is treated as a Sunday of Easter. In our Anglican tradition, Easter Sunday is the first Sunday of Eastertide and the following Sunday (Low Sunday) is the second Sunday of Eastertide and so on for six Sundays. The Liturgical colors are gold or white.



We have only one Feast Day (see page 3 of this Newsletter) this month on May 1st (and the color is Red) - **The Feast Day of St. Philip and St. James, Apostles**. On May 14, we will celebrate Ascension Day - the Christian holiday that commemorates Jesus Christ's bodily ascension into heaven, 40 days after his resurrection on Easter Sunday. It's also known as the Feast of the Ascension or, sometimes, Holy Thursday because it always falls on a Thursday. In the Episcopal Church this is a major Religious Holiday, and the color is white. Then, on May 24, we will celebrate the “Birthday of the Church” - Pentecost, and the color for this day is Red! So wear your finest red clothes and join in the celebration! Then we will continue the Season after Pentecost - which is called Ordinary Time. May 25th begins this continuation with the 7th week of Ordinary Time (weeks 1-6 were in January and February after The Epiphany). The month of May ends with the First Sunday after Pentecost - Trinity Sunday (the color is white). Then we are back to green for thirty more Sundays! Happy May!
