

# NEW WORSHIP SERVICE SCHEDULE







As the Deacons and Staff have met to coordinate the Worship Service Schedule, we have tried to balance two equal concerns: safety and capacity. We wanted to create an environment which was safe as possible and have enough services so that everyone who wanted to attend, could.

These concerns led us to adopt a four-service schedule during the Summer. We have learned a lot over these past few months about how to worship in this Covid time. We have learned who feels comfortable enough to come out and who doesn't. With all of this in mind, the Deacons have adopted on a new Worship Schedule.

Beginning Sunday, September 6, the service times will change to: Traditional: 9 AM and Wind: 10 AM.

Unfortunately, in keeping with state guidelines, there will be no Children's Sunday School or Childcare.

This arrangement will allow us to have enough capacity for everyone as well as maintain a safe environment. We appreciate your patience and understanding with all of the changes due to Covid-19. We will get through this!

## SUMMER PROJECTS WRAPPING UP







Over the summer, we have been working on two major projects—paving the parking lot and equipping KJH and the Meetinghouse for streaming.

Prior to paving, a new conduit was also laid under the driveway linking the Morgan House and Cadwell buildings, increasing our ability to extend our network in the future. Grading and drainage issues were also addressed and the trees and bushes in the islands have been replaced. At long last, we are happy to report the repaving of the church parking lot is completed.

A special word of thanks to Rob Lundy and Ryan Spencer for their invaluable help with getting streaming up and running. (Rob designed the system and Ryan is wiring the spaces.) We are nearly complete with KJH and will soon move into the Meetinghouse. We are on track to begin streaming services, beginning with the Wind service, very soon. 
