WHEN I WAS AT GORDON COLLEGE,

there was a ministry called Barnabas that still exists today. Barnabas is an anonymous ministry that encourages students to take seriously the work of loving their neighbors. They actively seek to encourage others on campus in creative ways, like leaving care packages, notes or thank-you posters.

As a guy from New England I thought it

was hokey-until I read the New Testament. When we read the story of the early church, we see a culture

highlighted by encouragement and affirmation:

- Jesus affirmed people's faiths and highlighted the giving of the poor widow.
- Paul instructs Timothy to devote the church and himself to three things: (1) public reading of Scripture, (2) encouragement (the Greek word paraklesis can be translated also as help, exhort, comfort, urge), and (3) teaching (1 Timothy 4:13).
- Jesus calls the Holy Spirit another Helper (or Encourager, from the Greek).
- When Barnabas came to the church in Antioch, he "saw the grace of God" and encouraged them (Acts 11:23).

Our culture today is so different from that New Testament culture. People (known as trolls) sow hatred on social media by Continued on next page

Report from the Executive Board — Member Update

Financial Issues

There has been a significant change in First Church's financial condition since January 1, and the Executive Board and Finance Subcommittee want you to have an opportunity to be involved in choosing our church's path forward. As you know, at year's end, total giving through the first six months of the current fiscal year was within \$13,000 of our budget— 98% of our expectation. Meanwhile, *expenses* in advance of the winter season were at 93.4% of the amount budgeted and a well-controlled \$60,000 less than planned.

Fast forward to March 31, and our financial condition has deteriorated substantially. Giving for the year is only 92% of the amount budgeted, or \$74,000 less than planned. This reduced giving has diminished *total* income for the year to only 93.3% of the amount budgeted, or nearly \$95,000 less than projected. Meanwhile, seasonal expenses (heat, lighting for shorter days, snow removal, etc.) have increased our total costs to 96% of the budgeted amount, but still almost \$55,000 less than the amount planned.

This rapid reversal is having a significant adverse impact on our financial condition this year and could have an even more substantial impact as we begin to work on the budget for the year starting July 1.

How Should We Proceed?

Members of the Finance Subcommittee will share additional information and potential alternatives at the **Annual Meeting this Sunday, April 29.** No vote is scheduled.

We plan to provide you with a summary of the current and projected financial details at the Annual Meeting. At the same time, we will share a few potential options for your consideration.

We intend to allow you time to consider the information, so that you can share your preferences with us before or during the **June 10 Financial Meeting**, when the budget is usually adopted.

Our Church Makes a Difference

By supporting First Church, you help much more than just the people and facilities that constitute your church home—you also support the Church's outreach. Here are some recent examples:

posting inflammatory messages and pictures. We also read attention-getting headlines that criticize individuals and organizations, focusing more on the problems than the solutions.

Let's face it, as New Englanders who live in this society, we see this negative mindset creep into church. It is something we struggle with at First Church, isn't it? But with God's help, we can be transformed.

Yes, we are to recognize when someone sins. We are to shine the light of Christ on the dark areas of our world. We are to speak the truth. But let's not forget that we are to do this with love. Let's also not forget these other New Testament values:

- Jesus told us to turn the other cheek (Matthew 5:39).
- When we correct others, we are to do so in a spirit of gentleness (Galatians 6:1).
- Jesus warns us against noticing the speck in someone's eyes and being unaware of the plank in our own (Matthew 7:3).

We are to be a people who encourage and affirm one another. We are to see what God's grace is doing in others, and encourage them. This is not about creating a culture of positivity but one that is biblical.

If we want to be a people who see His Kingdom come and His will be done in our church and in the world around us, then we are to love one another and share the love of Jesus with those in our own church and communities—and beyond.
