Men's Retreat Nears!


Attention Mighty Men of God!

Executive Board — Member Update

Money Matters



This month, the Board is updating the Congregation on First Church's financial status over the summer and the first quarter of this fiscal year. We are delighted to report that over the summer our giving recovered significantly, largely replacing the shortfall from

January and February. So far this fiscal year, giving is down slightly against last year. First Church has received about \$273,000 against a budget of \$290,000, but expenses are down even more, with the result being that overall income is about \$12,000 over expenses.

We want to point out that your giving supports great things here at First Church. An overview of what your contributions enable is as follows:

- OUTREACH First Church will distribute a truly impressive \$125,000, directly supporting missionary activities, including support to our missionaries here and abroad, Hartford City Missions, South Park Inn, and many others.
- INREACH We will spend about \$130,000 on internal programs this year, for our Midweek Connect dinners, *Di-vorceCare*, *GriefShare*, Alzheimer's Caregivers, Mastering Motherhood, Seniors' activities, and more.
- WORSHIP / MUSIC / PASTORAL CARE We will spend about \$530,000 to deliver the worship experience here at First Church, maintain a Youth and a Prayer Ministry, and provide pastoral care for our congregation.

All of this while we maintain our historic Meetinghouse, which provides a unique contribution to our Church and our community. It is too easy to lose sight of all of the services that First Church delivers with your offerings, and it is good to have the opportunity to point this out again, this month.

Unfortunately, there are still real concerns about our long-term financial health.

FIRST, the Board had to authorize repairs to the Morgan House and the Marsh Building connector. These repairs were noted during the Budget Meeting and are no surprise, but they will require some amount of funding from the Endowment, an amount that we won't fully know until the contractor quotes come in but which may be up to \$50,000.

SECOND, it is important to remember that the budget passed in April was balanced by assuming about \$120,000 be drawn from our unrestricted Endowment. Fortunately, due to recent staff retirements, this looks more like \$70,000 to \$80,000 now. However, given that currently our unrestricted funds are about \$300K, right now it seems that we will use about 40% of it this year. The inescapable conclusion is that we are on the borderline—and *if* we

have a significant shortfall, as we did early this year, then First Church will be in a difficult position again. Unfortunately, in September, giving fell off to \$80,000 versus a budget of \$96,000, so this remains a real concern to the Board.

Our goals are to strengthen and build our *community of Jesus followers*, enhance and demonstrate our love of God and one another, and make disciples who reach out and serve others. This is our mission, and these are our goals.

We trust that people want to be part of a church because they believe in its mission, trust its leadership, desire a sense of fellowship and belonging, appreciate its fiscal responsibility, and are assured that their time and other efforts to support God's cause will not be wasted. They want to know that their involvement will be changing lives for Christ, including their own.

So, thank you again for your financial support this summer. Over the next couple of years, the Board and Church Administration will continue to work to achieve a budget that does not rely on our Endowment. The Board can only ask that you continue your financial support of First Church and prayerfully consider adding to your contributions so that we can continue our service to God and our neighbors here in our local communities.

Our Church Makes a Difference

By supporting First Church, you help much more than just the people and facilities that constitute your church home—you also support the Church's outreach. Here are some recent examples:

- Mastering Motherhood is off to a great start, with about 60 women attending the initial sessions. This is proving to be an extraordinary outreach, given that most of the women are not members of First Church—providing us with an opportunity to positively impact their lives in a real way, thereby opening the door for God to work in them through our witness in these classes.
- Likewise, Trail Life USA Troop 1635 is also starting well, with over 50 parents and children attending the initial sessions. Here, too, the majority are not from First Church, again presenting us with an opportunity to draw people to Christ through a positive program for children.

Status Update

The search for a **Music Director and Organist** is still ongoing. A promising candidate has been identified and First Church Leadership is having discussions with him about possibly joining us here at First Church.

Our **Midweek Connect** dinners-plus have resumed on Wednesdays, providing yet another way for members to build a stronger community at First Church. The dinners are followed by an evening of Bible study for adults—Glenn Sunshine's class "**Making Disciples Jesus' Way**" based on his book *The Kingdom Unleashed*, and Diane Galloway's class for women, "**No Other Gods: The Unrivaled Pursuit of Christ**"—along with activities for grades 1-4 and 5-8. There are several ways that members of our First Church community can be involved—you can volunteer to help with food preparation on Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday morning; you can provide transportation to guests in need; you can volunteer to serve and participate in the event itself on Thanksgiving Day; or you can support the meal by contributing needed food items.

Earlier this year, the deacons opted to launch a neighborhood initiative based on Grace Morgan's "Neighborhood Networkers," which some may recall from many years ago. The idea is to help us stay better connected as a church body and make sure we address concerns and needs promptly.

Each member of the congregation has been assigned to one of the current deacons. Every four months you will be contacted just to "check in."

Individuals occasionally have something on their mind or an issue that, for one reason or another, they are hesitant to bring to the attention of leadership or are unsure to whom to address it.

These periodic check-ins are the perfect opportunity for you to provide any feedback, prayer requests, needs, questions, or con-

cerns. Your deacon will convey the information to the Neighborhood Deacon Leader, who will ensure it gets directed appropriately.

Of course, we encourage you to contact any of the deacons at *any* time as conditions arise, or to attend one of the monthly deacons' meetings. We are here to serve you.

We sincerely desire to function as a church family and to make sure members know they are each loved and valued.

Unquestionably, we don't want anyone to feel overlooked; therefore, if a deacon hasn't reached you by the end of the year, it may simply mean that we do not have your current phone/email/street address on file.
