Friends,

We are glad you are here with us and hope you sense God's presence in worship today. If there is any way we can be of help to you, don't hesitate to ask. Here are a few of the questions we often hear from our guests when they first visit:

- ~ **How long is the worship service here at Faith?** Our worship services typically run 60 to 70 minutes.
- ~ **How can I introduce myself?** We'd love to meet you after the service; don't hesitate to introduce yourself! You can also visit our webpage (www.faithpresby.org), and click on the "I'm New" tab and then the "Introduce Yourself" button. This is a great way to let the pastoral staff know who you are and how we might welcome and serve you. Also, stop by the Welcome Center on the way out. We have a gift waiting for you there!
- ~ **I have kids. Are they welcome here?** Absolutely! We love the sounds of children in the sanctuary. During the children's message at the 9:00 a.m. worship service, kids up to 6th grade are invited to come up front to listen in. Having them stay with you to listen is also fine. After the children's message, children are invited down the hall to Room 4 (grades 3 to 6) and Room 5 (Pre-K to 2nd grade) with our children's staff. Nursery care is available throughout the 9:00 a.m. worship service in Room 7.
- ~ **Are there classes for adults?** Yes. Check the bulletin and listen for announcements in worship about upcoming classes. We currently have in-person and online classes.
- ~ **What if I have trouble hearing the service?** If you have difficulty hearing, please ask one of our ushers for a personal receiver for the hearing impaired. Also, a T-Loop hearing-assist system is available in the back four pews on the right side of the sanctuary. Set your hearing aid to the "T" setting.
- ~ **How can I find out more information about Faith?** Feel free to speak to any of us and if we can't answer your questions, we'll find somebody who can. Our website is a great source of information: www.faithpresby.org. Also, *This Week @ Faith* is a weekly email that goes out on Mondays with information about upcoming opportunities and activities. Email Laura Anderson in our office at landerson@faithpresby.org if you'd like to be included on the email distribution list.
- ~ **What if I'm interested in exploring membership or deeper involvement at Faith?** If you'd like to know more about becoming a member at Faith, or want to understand how you can begin or continue to grow in your Christian faith, we encourage you to contact one of our pastors. A Theological Exploration of the PCUSA's Constitution




Have you ever wondered why the first words spoken in worship are not "Good morning" but "The Lord be with you"? Or wondered why we recite creeds and confessions in worship? (And exactly what *are* creeds and confessions, anyway?) What do Presbyterians mean when we say that we are "Reformed and always reforming"? And why, oh why, do Presbyterians care so much about doing everything "decently and in order"?

The answers to these and so many other questions can be found, at least in part, in our denomination's two-volume constitution, better known as the Book of Confessions and the Book of Order. And while you may be thinking that, surely, church constitutional documents must be dull as dirt, they are not! In fact, these two books don't just help us to understand who we are as Presbyterians; they can help us anchor our life as Christians and as a congregation more deeply in the person and the mission of our Triune God. So let's explore these volumes together! Join us for this three-week introduction to our Presbyterian constitution. We won't get bogged down in the details but will aim for a bird's-eye view that helps us focus on the breadth and beauty of the theology that undergirds these living documents.

For our first class on January 11, it will be helpful for participants to read in advance the first chapter (7 pages) of the Book of Order on "The Mission of the Church." You'll find hard copies of the chapter on the top shelf of the rack to the immediate right of Laura's office door. Or, use the online link that will be sent in tomorrow's "This Week @ Faith" email.

Annual Congregational Celebration


Sunday, January 25, at 12:15 p.m.

New Online Class Starts This Wednesday

SLOWING DOWN ... To CATCH UP WITH JESUS

Wednesdays, January 7 through February 11

Jesus continually asks us, “What do you want me to do for you?” How often do you answer, “Slow me down, Lord!” More and more, it seems people are actually *incapable* of slowing down, both within themselves as well as in their anxious, frantic lives. Yet, Jesus modeled balanced living for us, and He invites us to join Him in that lifestyle.



Dallas Willard said, “If I had only one word to describe Jesus it would be *relaxed*.” In Matthew 11: 28, Jesus tells us, “Come to me. Keep company with me, and you’ll learn to live lightly and freely.” (MSG)

This six-week class is an invitation to explore the concept of “hurry sickness” and to practice what it means to become like our unhurried Savior. We will seek to declare, “I want what *He* has!” And then go after it. Our vision will be to encounter Jesus not as frantically busy or demanding, but as present, attentive, and deeply kind.

There is no assigned book for this class. We will be using articles, podcasts, and videos created by spiritual formation giants who bring hope and healing to our addiction to hurry and busyness.



¹⁻³ In light of all this, here's what I want you to do. While I'm locked up here, a prisoner for the Master, I want you to get out there and walk—better yet, run!—on the road God called you to travel. I don't want any of you sitting around on your hands. I don't want anyone strolling off, down some path that goes nowhere. And mark that you do this with humility and discipline—not in fits and starts, but steadily, pouring yourselves out for each other in acts of love, alert at noticing differences and quick at mending fences.

⁴⁻⁶ You were all called to travel on the same road and in the same direction, so stay together, both outwardly and inwardly. You have one Master, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who rules over all, works through all, and is present in all. Everything you are and think and do is permeated with Oneness.



Message Notes

Questions to Consider...

The following questions and scriptures are provided for Life Groups and individuals who want to reflect further on today's message.

1. Read Ephesians 4:1-6 again. What stands out to you? Read *The Message* paraphrase and take note of the way Eugene Peterson paraphrases these verses. What do you notice?
2. Why do you think Paul places such an emphasis on unity in the church? Why the string of “one’s” and “all’s” in verses 4-6? What point is he trying to make?
3. What do you make of the fact that in John 17 Jesus prays that we (i.e., the church) would be united in the same way that he is united to his Father? Is our unity really that deep? If so, what are the implications of such unity?
4. Why do you believe Jesus says that the way we love one another in the church is what makes us most stand out to others in the world? (See John 13:35)
5. Why do you think that there is so much division in the church? Why do we so often allow the things that divide the rest of the world to divide us?
6. German theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer once wrote this about the church: “He who loves his dream of community more than the Christian community itself becomes a destroyer of the latter, even though his personal intentions may be ever so honest and earnest and sacrificial. Christian brotherhood is not an ideal which we must realize; it is rather a reality created by God in which we may participate.” What is he saying? Do you agree? Honestly, which do you love more, your dream of what the church should be like or the actual church just as it is?
7. Do you have places in the church family where you are practicing loving community with those you otherwise might only be able to tolerate? If not, what is one step you can take this week to begin doing so?
8. What sorts of things must we do here at Faith to maintain the unity of the Spirit and the bond of peace? Be as specific and practical as possible.

Meeting With God This Week

To help you LISTEN to God...

For your continued times of meeting with God daily, we offer the following passages from God's Word for your reflection. If you need a Bible, let us know and we'll give you one. We encourage you to keep a journal at hand to write down what you hear as you listen to God's Word. If you are new to all this, these steps may help you get started:

Invite - Find a time and space where you can have at least fifteen minutes of privacy and silence. Begin by taking a moment to simply ask God to meet you. Expect God to answer your prayer and show up.

Scripture - Read slowly through the passage for the day (we offer suggestions below). Read it again, if you like. Pay attention to phrases or ideas that particularly strike you.

Listen and Reflect - Use a journal to write down what you hear God saying in these verses. What is God telling you about himself? What is God telling you about your life? What is God telling you he wants you to do or to do differently? What questions are raised? What promises are revealed? Write what you hear.

Respond - Use the 3 R's. **#1 - Rejoice!** What have I heard from God which causes me to praise God and give thanks? Pray accordingly. **#2—Repent.** What have I heard from God that brings to light sin in my life or change that needs to take place? **#3—Request.** What have I heard from God that informs the way I pray for myself and others? (The guide in the column to the right, "To Help You Speak with God," may be useful as you pray for others this week.)
