Friends,

We are glad you are here with us and hope you sense God's presence in worship today. If there is any way we can be of help to you, don't hesitate to ask. Here are a few of the questions we often hear from our guests when they first visit:

- ~ How long is the worship service here at Faith? Our worship services typically run 60 to 70 minutes.
- ~ How can I introduce myself? We'd love to meet you after the service; don't hesitate to introduce yourself! You can also visit our webpage (www.faithpresby.org), and click on the "I'm New" tab and then the "Introduce Yourself" button. This is a great way to let the pastoral staff know who you are and how we might welcome and serve you. Also, stop by the Welcome Center on the way out. We have a gift waiting for you there!
- ~ I have kids. Are they welcome here? Absolutely! We love the sounds of children in the sanctuary. During the children's message at the 9:00 a.m. worship service, kids up to 6th grade are invited to come up front to listen in. Having them stay with you to listen is also fine. After the children's message, children are invited down the hall to Room 4 (grades 3 to 6) and Room 5 (Pre-K to 2nd grade) with our children's staff. Nursery care is available throughout the 9:00 a.m. worship service in Room 7.
- ~ Are there classes for adults? Yes. Check the bulletin and listen for announcements in worship about upcoming classes. We currently have in-person and online classes.
- ~ What if I have trouble hearing the service? If you have difficulty hearing, please ask one of our ushers for a personal receiver for the hearing impaired. Also, a T-Loop hearing-assist system is available in the back four pews on the right side of the sanctuary. Set your hearing aid to the "T" setting.
- ~ How can I find out more information about Faith? Feel free to speak to any of us and if we can't answer your questions, we'll find somebody who can. Our website is a great source of information: www.faithpresby.org. Also, This Week @ Faith is a weekly email that goes out on Mondays with information about upcoming opportunities and activities. Email Laura Anderson in our office at landerson@faithpresby.org if you'd like to be included on the email distribution list.

2026 Flower Calendar Available



What Walmart Can't Tell You: The Theology of Christmas

December 14 & 21 10:15 a.m., Grace Room Facilitator: Rev. Rick Hull

Just as we find the redemptive plan of God in every aspect of Old and New Testament scriptures, so the theology of our Lord's grace and calling can be



found throughout the story of Christmas. In this short study, we rediscover the theological foundations of our culture's most universally celebrated occasion, and claim again the account of a message that transcends presents and poinsettias to transform hearts and change the world. Moving from the loveliness of mere celebration to the cosmic love of God, this is the story that the world needs to hear, and the joy that will lift hearts long after the ornaments go back in the box.

Learn to Use Faith's AEDs

You may have noticed Faith's two new AEDs -- Automated External Defibrillators. One is located in the Welcome Center, and the other is in the Link Hall foyer. We would like to train as many people as possible to use



these devices so that we are better prepared as a congregation to save a life if ever that is needed.

Our Worship Team will be heading up an in-

person training in early 2026, and we hope you will consider attending. In the meantime, if you would like to become familiar with how to use these life-saving devices, these QR codes will take you to online training videos. The code on top



is for a basic, six-minute instructional video. The code on the bottom is for a more comprehensive, 38 -minute video.

Give Life Groups a Try! Three-Week "Taster" Is Coming

Many of us here at Faith have found great joy through participating in Life Groups. These are



small groups that meet weekly or bimonthly to study Scripture, reflect on the sermons, pray, fellowship, share a meal, and sometimes serve together. At their heart, Life Groups are an opportunity to "do" life together, hence the name.

Year-End Financial Deadlines

As 2025 draws towards its close, Faith's Finance Team wants to be sure you are aware of these important deadlines for giving and for payment of reimbursements and invoices:

If you would like your **giving** to be counted in 2025, it must be received in the office on or before Wednesday, December 31, or postmarked in 2025.

For those requesting **reimbursement** for purchases made for the church in 2025, completed Request for Reimbursement (RFR) forms that include the elder's authorizing signature must be submitted to Marlys Emery, Faith's Financial Assistant, by the end of the day on **Wednesday**, **December 17**. If you leave an RFR in an elder's mailbox for signature, be sure to contact that elder promptly and let him or her know it is there. Remember that he or she will need enough advance notice so as to have time to swing by the church and complete and submit the form to Marlys by December 17th.

Any **invoice** to be paid out of the 2025 budget year must be submitted to Marlys Emery, along with the completed Request for Payment form, by the end of the day on **Wednesday**, **December 17**.

Through the Christmas Joy Offering, we reflect God's perfect gift to us, with generous support of church leaders among us – past, present and future – who have pointed us to God.



Isaiah 35:1-10 (NRSV)

¹The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus 2 it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing. The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. They shall see the glory of the Lord, the majesty of our God. ³Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees. ⁴Say to those who are of a fearful heart, "Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God. He will come with vengeance, with terrible recompense. He will come and save you." ⁵Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; 6then the lame shall leap like a deer, and the tongue of the speechless sing for joy. Are We There Yet?

Questions to Consider...

The following questions and scriptures are provided for Life Groups and individuals who want to reflect further on today's message.

- 1. Read Isaiah 35:1-10 again. This passage is filled with stunning imagery. What image is the most stunning to you? What image most stands out?
- 2. If this is a prophecy about what the Lord is going to do in our world, what parts of this passage do you find hard to believe? What parts do you find easy to believe?
- 3. Jeff mentioned that there are four aspects of the coming kingdom "superbloom" which are highlighted in these verses. Which one stands out to you? Which one do you need to hear today? Why?

The glory of God will be revealed

The Lord will come

The Lord will set things right

We will travel on The Way

- 4. How do you find yourself" "sighing" these days? What do you do when everything seems hopeless? Where do you turn?
- 5. The passage exhorts us to strengthen weak hands, make firm feeble knees, and tell those with fearful hearts to be strong. What are practical ways we can actually encourage one another when the journey towards glory seems so overwhelmingly long and difficult that we want to give up?
- 6. What is it that you are waiting for God to do right now? How long have you been waiting? Do you believe he will do it?
- 7. How much of the time should we be anticipating what is to come in the Kingdom of Heaven? Can one think about this too much? It was apparently Oliver Wendell Holmes who criticized those he thought were "too heavenly minded to be of any earthly good." Is that a danger?
- 8. Is there laughter in heaven? Is that how you picture it? If so, what will people be laughing about?

For your continued times of meeting with God daily, we offer the following passages from God's Word for your reflection. If you need a Bible, let us know and we'll give you one. We encourage you to keep a journal at hand to write down what you hear as you listen to God's Word. If you are new to all this, these steps may help you get started:

Invite - Find a time and space where you can have at least fifteen minutes of privacy and silence. Begin by taking a moment to simply ask God to meet you. Expect God to answer your prayer and show up.

Scripture - Read slowly through the passage for the day (we offer suggestions below). Read it again, if you like. Pay attention to phrases or ideas that particularly strike you.

Listen and Reflect - Use a journal to write down what you hear God saying in these verses. What is God telling you about himself? What is God telling you about your life? What is God telling you he wants you to do or to do differently? What questions are raised? What promises are revealed? Write what you hear.

Respond - Use the 3 R's. #1 - Rejoice! What have I heard from God which causes me to praise God and give thanks? Pray accordingly. #2—Repent. What have I heard from God that brings to light sin in my life or change that needs to take place? #3—Request. What have I heard from God that informs the way I pray for myself and others? (The guide in the column to the right, "To Help You Speak with God," may be useful as you pray for others this week.)
