

Our June selection is *The Last Castle: The Epic Story of Love, Loss, and American Royalty in the Nation's Largest Home* by Denise Kiernan. The home is Biltmore, located in North Carolina.

The Biltmore Estate was imagined by George Vanderbilt and constructed by Frederick Law Olmsted and Richard Morris Hunt. The estate was three times the size of Washington, DC, when it was built, not including the village constructed outside its gates. Vanderbilt married Edith Stuyvesant Dresser and together they welcomed the wealthy and famous to their estate while at the same time



developing economic and educational opportunities for the people living near the estate. This fascinating story spans many decades to the present. It will make us want to take a field trip to North Carolina!

Thank you to all who supported this year's 9<sup>th</sup> annual Walk 4 Water event, whether it be by walking with us, donating, or both! As we gathered on the patio after 9:00 a.m. worship on May 21<sup>st</sup>, the children and youth welcomed us with beautiful chalk art and a special rendition of *Wade in / Walk 4 Water* led by Pastor Brett on guitar. Afterwards,

we walked one mile to the Cabana Club South, where we collected water and then returned to Faith, where we poured it into the "well" (a.k.a. the patio fountain). Abba Tetemke, priest with the Tigray Orthodox Church, offered a blessing for the delicious feast of traditional cuisine and coffee hosted by the women of the Tigray church. What a wonderful celebration!

If you have not yet had the opportunity, there is still time to make a donation. Remember that all donations up to a combined \$5,000 are matched, thereby doubling your contribution and its impact. All funds are earmarked for clean water projects in the Abaya, Ethiopia, Area Development Program, which we have co-sponsored through World Vision for 13 years. # **Doing Justice Intensive: Racism**

### Wednesday Evenings, July 5 to August 2 7:00 to 8:30 p.m., Grace Room

In this intensive course, we will touch the surface of the diverse perspectives and rich literature addressing racism and reconciliation that is available today. Together, we will explore three different biblical responses offered by Christians as we try to understand better the theology and values that undergird people's differing viewpoints about race and reconciliation.

The purpose of this Intensive is to facilitate a conversation among people about race and prejudice that may be more honest and go deeper than previously experienced. Participants will be asked to Doing Justice: RACISM

engage in material at home between gatherings, and then come prepared to listen to the perspectives of one another in the intensive. Please be aware that this course may include language, ideas, and images that could trigger strong emotions. Our goal, to which we will strongly adhere, will be to listen carefully to better understand one another and not to convince one another of our various positions.

## **YOUTH MISSION TRIP**

## Metlakatla, Alaska August 3-12, 2023

For the last 11 years, in cooperation with the Metlakatla Presbyterian Church, our presbytery's mission agency, through its Disaster Response Ministries, has sponsored a life-changing mission trip to Metlakatla – a Tsimshian native village on Annette Island, off the coast of southeastern Alaska. This mission experience has been transformative for all participants. Powerful friendships exist between our youth and the Metlakatla youth, and many stay connected even years after their participation in this extraordinary opportunity.





The presbytery has been invited to return to this majestic island to partner with the Metlakatla Presbyterian Church, rekindle relationships with the Tsimshian youth, and provide basketball, science and dance camps. Participants will also complete work projects for the community and share Christ's love through worship, support, and expanding cultural awareness. In addition to partnering with the church, we will be experiencing the beauty of this ancient culture through invitations to the long house for clan dancing and learning about their exquisite carvings and totem poles. We will have the privilege of helping to celebrate Founder's Day on the island on August 7, 2023.

The mission trip begins in Ketchikan, the salmon capitol of the world. There we will have an orientation, as well as go zip-lining through the Pacific Northwest rainforest and take a chartered whale-watching ferry on our way to the island.

The trip is open to youth ages 13 to 21, and it is limited in size. Youth **must** be willing to step out of their comfort zones and to take an active and enthusiastic role in one of our three camps: basketball, science, or dance. This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to experience this breath-taking environment and its rich cultural traditions, as well as a unique setting in which youth are encouraged to grow in faith and leadership.



Participant cost is \$800.00, which **does not** include airfare. It does include food, lodging at the church, ground and ferry transportation, and adventures. Food at the airport and souvenirs are not included. Note: Proof of vaccination is absolutely required BY THE TRIBE.
