

Only one year, but what a year! Beginning on Winston Churchill's first day as Prime Minister, through the unrelenting Blitz bombing that killed 45,000 British citizens, Erik Larson tells readers the story of that critical year in *The Splendid and the Vile*. Churchill engaged in political brinksmanship as well as the domestic dramas going on in his own home. The story unfolds at 10 Downing Street, his country home, Chequers, and Churchill's wartime retreat, Ditchley. The challenge facing the Prime Minister was how to hold the country together while persuading President Franklin Roosevelt to join the battle.



Consider this thoughtful quote: "*The Splendid and the Vile* takes readers out of today's political dysfunction and back to a time of true leadership, when – in the face of unrelenting horror – Churchill's eloquence, courage, and perseverance bound a country, and a family, together."

As I review the first six months of 2023, I am so grateful for the amazing people who have chosen to use their gifts and skills to serve the people of Faith Church and the surrounding community through the worship services and classes provided. Thank you to each of you!

• January:

- o Laura Anderson provided a class on the "First Words of Jesus"—an insightful study of the meaning and significance of the words that Jesus used to introduce His ministry to the world.
- o "Why Jesus Loves Me," taught by Alice Parente, used James Bryan Smith's recently published book, *The Good and Beautiful You: Discovering the Person Jesus Created You to Be*, to help us discover how God sees us as unceasing spiritual beings within whom Christ lovingly dwells.

• February and March:

- We provided a "Reflective Retreat" the weekend before Lent that blessed people in preparing for the season of Lent and its six-week contemplation of Christ's redemptive work.
- Rev. Dennis Montzingo began a four-month class on the life of King David. The course ran to the end of May and was both challenging and uplifting as we learned why David was considered a man of God's heart...and why we are too.

April and May:

- O Alice Parente began a six-week series, "Learning Humility," based on a book written by Father Richard Foster. It is a great examination of how humility becomes the basis for transformation and is a call to consider in our own lives and culture how this value can change so much.
- The annual Women's Retreat was a great success. Rev. Amanda Nevin, Stated Clerk of the San Joaquin Presbytery, spoke on "Always Perfectly Loved (by God)." Decluttering By Faith




Do you have too much *stuff*? If you have been wanting to declutter and simplify your home, please join us for this six-week class!

Decluttering by Faith is a devotional that explores what the Bible has to say about all of our stuff. Through this lens, we're able to look at our physical possessions more critically, realizing that they don't add the peace or security we're searching for. Each week focuses on a different area of our house to declutter, such as kitchens, clothing, and sentimental items. We will meet to view a 15-minute video, discuss the previous week's devotionals (except



for the first week), and share our progress and experiences as we support and encourage each other in our decluttering journey. Between gatherings, we're invited to complete five daily devotionals and a decluttering challenge on our own.



Doing Justice Intensive: Racism

Wednesday Evenings, July 5 to August 2 7:00 to 8:30 p.m., Grace Room

In this intensive course, we will touch the surface of the diverse perspectives and rich literature addressing racism and reconciliation that is available today. Together, we will explore three different biblical responses offered by Christians as we try to understand better the theology and values that undergird people's differing viewpoints about race and reconciliation.

The purpose of this Intensive is to facilitate a conversation among people about race and prejudice that may be more honest and go deeper than previously experienced. Participants will be asked to



engage in material at home between gatherings, and then come prepared to listen to the perspectives of one another in the intensive. Please be aware that this course may include language, ideas, and images that could trigger strong emotions. Our goal, to which we will strongly adhere, will be to listen carefully to better understand one another and not to convince one another of our various positions.

OUR SPEAKER

Our speaker this year is Rev. Dr. Steve Wise, who hails from South Carolina. His "claim to fame" is his friendship with Jeff Chapman and his many basketball victories over Jeff in seminary. Steve and his wife, Becky, have a son and daughter, both of whom are married and live in South Carolina.

Since 2019 Steve has served as the Senior Pastor of Westminster Presbyterian Church in Spartanburg, SC. His ministry focuses on preaching, teaching, and building relationships with people in the church and community.

Prior to accepting the call at Westminster, Steve worked for nearly 30 years as an associate pastor and Young Life church partner. Those years were spent focused on one school and students in his church. He continues to be involved in Young Life and youth ministry.

Steve graduated from Wofford College, Princeton Theological Seminary (MDiv), and Gordon- Conwell Theological Seminary (DMin).

OUR THEME: "LIVING IN THE REALITY OF GOD'S KINGDOM OF GOODNESS AND LOVE"

For our retreat weekend, Steve will be drawing on Scripture and the works of Dallas Willard as he addresses these questions: What is real? Who is well-off? Who is good? How can we become good? Willard identifies these four questions as the foundational part of our worldview – how we see the world as it affects how we live in it. During our time with Steve, we will consider how Jesus answers these four questions in His life and teaching so that we may live lives in the reality of God's kingdom of goodness and love.

YOUTH MISSION TRIP

Metlakatla, Alaska August 3-12, 2023







The presbytery has been invited to return to this majestic island to partner with the Metlakatla Presbyterian Church, rekindle relationships with the Tsimshian youth, and provide basketball, science and dance camps. Participants will also complete work projects for the community and share Christ's love through worship, support, and expanding cultural awareness. In addition to partnering with the church, we will be experiencing the beauty of this ancient culture through invitations to the long house for clan dancing and learning about their exquisite carvings and totem poles. We will have the privilege of helping to celebrate Founder's Day on the island on August 7, 2023.

The mission trip begins in Ketchikan, the salmon capitol of the world. There we will have an orientation, as well as go zip-lining through the Pacific Northwest rainforest and take a chartered whale-watching ferry on our way to the island.

The trip is open to youth ages 13 to 21, and it is limited in size. Youth *must* be willing to step out of their comfort zones and to take an active and enthusiastic role in one of our three camps: basketball, science, or dance. This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to experience this breath-taking environment and its rich cultural traditions, as well as a unique setting in which youth are encouraged to grow in faith and leadership.



Participant cost is \$800.00, which **does not** include airfare. It does include food, lodging at the church, ground and ferry transportation, and adventures. Food at the airport and souvenirs are not included. Note: Proof of vaccination is absolutely required BY THE TRIBE.
