


## **Monday Evening Book Club**

Wednesday Evenings, 7:00 – 8:30 p.m., Zoom October 11 through November 15, 2023 Facilitator: Alice Parente




Healing prayer has been largely ignored in the Western church. Either it doesn't happen anymore, or it has been relegated as a subset of a subset of the "gifts of the Spirit" that few really know what to do with. "Our thoughts and prayers are with you. Sorry for your loss. I guess all we can do is pray." How many times do we say and receive these over-used expressions of concern...and then neglect to really pray at a deep and meaningful level? Many of us are afraid to petition God for specific things, because we are afraid He won't give us what we want.

In this class, we will seek a better understanding of healing prayer in the context of a community of faith. And we will roll up our sleeves and look at some practical aspects of how to pray for all kinds of healing in the company of others. Exploring, studying, and praying together, we will examine prayer methods that require us, at least for the moment, to have faith and to exercise that faith in a disciplined way.

Together we will engage with articles and podcasts created by renowned pioneers of faith who embraced healing prayer as a vital part of their walk with Jesus. We will learn about holy laughter in healing and about childlike approaches to healing prayer. With good humor and real life examples, we will aim to demystify this most mystifying and magnificent of gifts.

Julie's Purse Project obtains gently used purses filled with essential items that women would want or need in their purses if they were starting over with nothing. The filled purses are delivered to nonprofit organizations throughout Northern California directly helping and impacting the lives of sex trafficking and domestic violence survivors, women being released from incarceration, Camp Fire survivors and women experiencing homelessness.

Julie's Purse Project will be the focus of our Christmas mission this year. We will be collecting items such as toothbrushes, toothpaste, feminine hygiene products, hair ties, lotion, shampoos, conditioners, combs, brushes, makeup, lip balm, etc. All items must be new and unused.

## September Update About Faith's Stewardship Ministry

Our primary task is oversight of the Stewardship Campaign. The campaign begins with a mailed letter from the Stewardship Elder followed by Commitment Sunday.

The Stewardship Team oversees requests for fundraising. Events in place annually are:



Stewardship Team members Jon Coupal and John Rodriguez are available to the congregation for questions regarding estate planning.

October 1, 2023, will be the culmination of our 2024 Stewardship Campaign. In an effort to focus on stewardship as time, talents, and treasures, Commitment Sunday and the Ministry Faire will be held together. Elders will speak with the congregation in both services on September 17 and 24 to give information about their area of service as Elder and to share how the congregation's time, talents, and treasures are used for God's Work. Stewardship packets will be available for pick up after both services on September 24.

On July 17, 2022, Smart Saver Banks were presented between services to our elementary-age children and their families. We have 8 remaining Smart Saver Banks. Family Ministry Director Jacob Zvolanek presented the opportunity for new families to receive training and banks between services in August; however, no families responded. Jacob has advised revisiting this later in the Fall.



## **September Update About Faith's Family Ministry**

"Do you, as members of the Church of Jesus Christ, promise to, alongside parents, guide and nurture our children, by word and deed, with love and prayer, encouraging them to know and follow Christ and to be faithful members of His church?" (paraphrase of the Question to the Congregation following EVERY child's baptism)

If you have answered yes (or "We do"), then YOU are an integral part of what is known as FAMILY MINISTRY!! What exactly does that mean, you ask? Family Ministry provides opportunities for everyone to come alongside parents who are raising their children in the faith in a variety of ways, anywhere from praying for the family who might be sitting next to you in the pew, to helping in the nursery or classes on Sunday mornings, to supporting a youth who is participating in the 30 Hour Famine, and many other ways.

The is a dedicated group of Faith members and staff who meet monthly to plan and discuss ways to encourage and support families as they seek to make Christ known in their homes.

The Family Ministry team is tasked with the responsibility of providing many ongoing opportunities on a weekly, monthly, and annual basis.

Thankfully we are blessed with three Faith staff members who do the "heavy lifting" required for many of these programs, as described on the next page.



**RISE KIDS' WORSHIP** is our weekly 9:00 a.m. Sunday worship experience, consisting of three children's programs: Nursery (0-3yrs), Godly Play (Pre-K thru 2<sup>nd</sup> grade), and Worship & Wonder (3<sup>rd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> grades). Curriculum is provided, with 20+ leaders and assistants who are mainly volunteers, plus Jacob, Brett, and Madelyn. We are mandated to provide two background-checked adults (18+) for each of these programs.

**YOUTH GROUP** (7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade) meets once a week, typically on Wednesday evenings under the energetic leadership of Brett, Jacob, and dedicated volunteers. Through messages and activities, the youth build friendships and community centered around Christ and learn how a well-nurtured faith leads to service and action.



#### KIDS CLUB is held twice a month on

Wednesdays from 5:00 to 6:30 p.m. This is an opportunity for 3<sup>rd</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> graders to gather, play group games, have dinner and reflect on some encouragement from scripture. The hope of this program is to build on the friendships that children develop with one another on Sundays, as well as to give them a "taste" of Youth Group.

**FAMILY DISCIPLESHIP** is a monthly evening program designed to support parents in thinking through and discussing how we pass along our faith to our children. A variety of topics, speakers, and videos are provided, along with dinner and childcare.

**VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL (VBS)** is offered each summer, typically during the last full week of June. This has been a longstanding tradition at Faith, beginning in the late '80s/early '90s. Children from Pre-school age through 6<sup>th</sup> grade are welcome, with staff members, summer interns, and youth and adult volunteers providing amazing, Christ-centered messages, music, mission opportunities, Bible stories, outdoor games, arts and crafts, and of course snacks. This year's VBS was held June 26-30 with the curriculum theme of "Twists & Turns – Following Jesus Changes the Game". Seventy-five children participated, and our mission project of providing art supplies and children's books to Family Promise was well-supported.





#### PEACE & GLOBAL WITNESS OFFERING

#### "You are With Me"

## "Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me." (Psalm 23:4, NRSV)

"God, you are with me." What a powerful statement of faith this is! Say it with me: "You are with me." How does that make you feel? Do you feel safe? Do you feel at peace? Do you sense the "blessed assurance" of God's Holy Spirit in your life?

The psalmist says that even though we walk through "the darkest valley," we fear no evil. The King James Version of the Bible, the one that many of us grew up reciting, says "the valley of the shadow of death." The shadow represents the uncertainty in our lives. The uncertainty of floods, tornadoes, hurricanes, earthquakes and climate change. The uncertainty of aggression through war, gun violence, human trafficking and international tensions. The uncertainty of employment, inflation and illness. Yes, the shadow of death is all around us.

Yet, in Christ, we can boldly proclaim, "You are with me. Your rod will protect me from uncertain foes who wish to do me harm, and your staff will guide me on the right path for your name's sake. I fear no evil." In so doing, you proclaim God's presence of peace – peace amid uncertainty – in your own life.

As a community of faith, we receive the Peace & Global Witness Offering, and as we do, we extend Christ's peace throughout our community and world even in these uncertain times. Twenty-five percent of the gifts we receive will stay right here in our church to work for peace and reconciliation on a more local level. Another 25% will support the peacemaking efforts in our mid council, and 50% will go to the Presbyterian Mission Agency for its ministries of peacemaking and global witness all around the world.

On World Communion Sunday, we will celebrate the Lord's Supper. Luke's Gospel tells us that on that very first Easter as Jesus was walking down the road to Emmaus, he met two disciples who did not recognize him. When they invited him to join them for a meal, Jesus took bread and blessed it. When he did, their eyes were opened, and their hearts were strangely warmed. They were in the "real presence" of the Risen Lord and Savior. Our hope is that when we share this holy meal, our eyes will also be opened, our hearts will be strangely warmed, and we will recognize the presence of the Risen Lord among us. Then we can boldly claim, "You are with me."
