

Do you remember reading *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn* by Mark Twain as a younger person and wondering what enslaved Jim, a main character in Twain's story, was experiencing on the adventure? No, me either! But, Percival Everett did just that. Everett wrote a best-selling novel featuring the adventures of Jim, or James as Jim liked to be called. It is a roller-coaster of a read. Laugh-out-loud funny and poignant by turns, this is a page turner! *James* is a 2025 Pulitzer Prize winner, a finalist for The Booker Prize, a National Book Award Winner, a New York Times 10 Best Books of 2024, and our January choice. 




"Decently and In Order" A Theological Exploration of the PCUSA's Constitution



Have you ever wondered why the first words spoken in worship are not "Good morning" but "The Lord be with you"? Or wondered why we recite creeds and confessions in worship? (And exactly what *are* creeds and confessions, anyway?) What do Presbyterians mean when we say that we are "Reformed and always reforming"? And why, oh why, do Presbyterians care so much about doing everything "decently and in order"?



The answers to these and so many other questions can be found, at least in part, in our denomination's two-volume constitution, better known as the *Book of Confessions* and the *Book of Order*. And while you may be thinking that, surely, church constitutional documents must be dull as dirt, they are not! In fact, these two books don't just help us to understand who we are as Presbyterians; they can help us anchor our life as Christians and as a congregation more deeply in the person and the mission of our Triune God. So let's explore these volumes together! Join us for this three-week introduction to our Presbyterian constitution. We won't get bogged down in the details but will aim for a bird's-eye view that helps us focus on the breadth and beauty of the theology that undergirds these living documents.

For our first class on January 11, it will be helpful for participants to read in advance the first chapter (7 pages) of the *Book of Order* on "*The Mission of the Church*." You'll find hard copies of the chapter on the top shelf of the rack to the immediate right of Laura's office door. Or, use the online link that will be sent in Monday's "This Week @ Faith" email.

MONTHLY FOCUS REPORT: PROPERTY

Report Date: December 2025

Our property team is responsible for everything inside, outside and around the Faith campus.

We maintain and repair the entire facility inside and out, including the roof, air conditioning units, parking lot, outdoor lighting, plumbing, and campus grounds.

In the past year, we re-surfaced the parking lot, repaired the roof above Link Hall, upgraded the leased antennas above the sanctuary, and replaced the roof over the narthex and sanctuary. We also assisted the Narthex Team in the remodel of the narthex.

At our recent meeting, most of the Property Team members walked the grounds to identify the locations of the water main shutoff valves and the sprinkler systems and their shutoff valves. We will leave a copy of the Sprinkler Irrigation and Utility System Manual in the main office.

We are currently exploring updates to our waterflow alarm panel because technology is changing and our current alarm panel is antiquated.

We are also obtaining bids to clean up the black areas on the ceiling panels of Link Hall, which have been determined not to be mold. Once we complete this project, we will retest in 6 months to confirm that there is no mold.

In the new year, we will obtain bids to replace the carpet in Classroom 2, the Sunday School rooms, and the office of the Director of Family Ministry.

This year we have added four new members to the property team: Jay Gilbert, Sue Kim, Randy Valenzano and Sylvia Warner. I am grateful for the extensive knowledge, expertise and skill that each member of the committee – newcomer and “long-timer” alike – shares with the congregation through their participation on the Property Team.

What has Session been up to lately? The following are some of the decisions which were made this season at Session and some of the areas of ministry which were celebrated. Unless otherwise determined, they are open meetings and church members are always encouraged to come listen in. We'll even share our snacks!

- **Welcoming New Members** – At our December meeting we welcomed in three new members: Barbara Johnson, Michele Yarbrough, and Tanis Toland. They will each be presented in worship in January. - **Position Descriptions Update** – Our Personnel Team, led by Elder Stan Keasling, is always working to keep our staff position description up to date. At our November meeting we updated our Office Manager and Director of Family Ministry position descriptions.
- **Sanejo Leonard Received Under Care** – Sanejo is an ordained minister in the Assemblies of God denomination, and she is seeking to transfer her ordination to the PCUSA (our denomination). At the recommendation of our Presbytery, she was encouraged to connect with the life and ministry of a local PCUSA church as she learns as much as she can about our tradition. She has chosen to connect with us here at Faith. Our elders, after hearing her testimony, pledged to support her in this transition however we can.
- **Communications Coordinator** – Session approved the creation of a part-time staff position to oversee communications. We will begin posting this job in January and hope to have somebody fill the position shortly after.
