
UPCOMING EVENTS AND OPPORTUNITIES






Books Added to the Library in 2025!



Please Don't Fall for Scams!

A couple of times every year, we hear from folks in the congregation, letting us know that they have received an email or text purportedly from Pastor Jeff and usually asking—directly or eventually—for some type of financial help. These are always scams. Please delete them and report them as a scam if you can. Do not respond to them, and **never** click on any link in them.

If you think the email *might* be legitimate, still do not respond to that email. Instead, start a new email to Jeff at his church email address and ask him to verify that he contacted you. Or, call the church directly. Do the same for any “fishy” email that purports to be from a staff member. Faith’s staff members will not contact individual members of the congregation by email, by text, or by any other means with requests for money or gift cards; they will never put this burden on you. Suspicious email or text? Ignore it or delete it!

From time to time, we as a congregation have the opportunity to contribute with our finances or with gift cards to special mission offerings, such after the Paradise fire or for Family Promise. When such an appeal goes out, it will be made publicly in worship, printed in the bulletin, and sent out to the entire church on our email distribution list. (Our “**This Week @ Faith**” and “**House to House**” emails also come via this distribution list.) Any request that comes via a channel other than these should be viewed with suspicion.

In you ever have concerns about the validity of a communication that purports to be from the church, please call the office. We’ll be glad to help you figure out if it is legitimate or not.

Life Together

What is Life Together? Life Together is a five-week interactive course geared toward bringing together people who want to grow with one another to be formed more fully as devoted followers of Jesus Christ here in this community of Faith. The course will include a balance of group gatherings and individual spiritual practices. The application to everyday life will be intensely practical. We explore both key doctrines and disciplines of the Christian faith, both of which are essential for spiritual growth.

Is this course for you? Ask yourself the following questions:

- Have you found yourself recently interested in Jesus and how you can have a personal and vibrant relationship with him as Savior and Lord?
- Are you tired of feeling “stuck” or “stalled” in your Christian faith?
- Are you finding it difficult, if not impossible, to become the sort of person you sense God made you to become?
- Are you new (or maybe not so new) to this congregation and eager to connect with others in this faith community at a deeper level?
- Are you interested in considering the commitment of membership here at Faith?

When is this course offered? Life Together will be offered on Sunday evenings from 6:00-7:30 p.m. on the following dates: **March 1, 8, 15, 22, 29.** A celebration dinner will be held at the end (date TBD). Though participants are encouraged to be present for every session, teachings can be recorded when needed. Sign-ups are taken well in advance. MONTHLY FOCUS REPORT: FINANCE

Report Date: January 2025

The Finance Committee is entrusted with stewarding the financial gifts offered by the congregation to support the ministry and mission of Faith Presbyterian Church.

Our team members carry out a wide range of financial responsibilities, including counting the weekly offering, issuing checks, reconciling bank accounts, and preparing financial reports.

We ensure that all gifts are recorded accurately and allocated to their designated accounts. These funds are then directed to their intended purposes, including paying bills, supporting mission partners, and sustaining the work of the church. We also maintain records of Giving Pledges and provide annual Giving Statements to all pledgers and contributors.

Each year, we prepare the proposed budget with input from every Ministry Team. After Session approves the budget, we present it to the congregation at the annual meeting, along with an update on the current financial status of Faith Presbyterian Church. Session reviews the budget in June to see if any adjustments are needed.

This year, Session implemented a policy to review annually our operating budget reserve account to make sure these funds are appropriately held. The Finance Team also oversees and enhances our church's database systems to support electronic communication with the congregation, including online giving, event registration, and fundraising efforts.

Most importantly, we recognize that we serve as conduits of God's gifts—receiving them from Him, through our church community, and directing them outward to share His Good News with the world.



The 2026 per capita apportionment is \$33.48 per member. As a reminder, this is the amount that Faith pays per member as a means of contributing towards the shared ecclesiastical costs of our denomination. If you are a member and able to do so, please consider covering your share of the apportionment. You will find a per capita envelope in your pledge box. 
Dear Members of Faith Presbyterian Church,

Session Highlights

What is Session? Session is the governing body of our congregation. Made up of 15 members (pastors and elders) who are called by God and elected by the congregation, Session is charged by God to oversee the ministry and mission of Faith Presbyterian Church. By God's grace, Session works hard to make sure that we are becoming, day by day, the sort of church God wants us to become – *a community loving Christ, building disciples, serving all.*



What has Session been up to lately? The following are some of the decisions which were made this season at Session and some of the areas of ministry which were celebrated. We hope you share in the enthusiasm of Session for all that God is doing in our midst. As a reminder, Session meetings are held the second Monday of most every month at 7:00 p.m. here at church. Unless otherwise determined, they are open meetings and church members are always encouraged to come listen in. We'll even share our snacks!

- Lord's Supper Celebrations Approved – It is our elders who approve all occasions when we celebrate the Lord's Supper together. Our elders approved those occasions for 2026, including our regular rhythm of celebrating the Lord's Supper each first Sunday of the month.
- Longterm Visioning – Our elders spent significant time this month continuing work which was begun at our off-site retreat in November. Our goal is to discern how the Lord may be calling us as a congregation to move out beyond our "walls" to bear witness to Christ in our city and beyond, especially with those who do not yet know Christ. Lots of ideas are being kicked around. Prayer is central.
- Ron Beams – The elders received word that Ron Beams was open to coming back into his role as Director of Congregational Care. After some discussion of this transition, the motion was enthusiastically affirmed. All such staffing decisions come through the Personnel Committee, led by Elder Stan Keasling.
- Focus Report – Elder Karen Chan gave a wonderful overview of the Finance Ministry, which she oversees.
