Welcome, Guests!

Friends,

We are glad you are here with us and hope you sense God's presence in worship today. If there is any way we can be of help to you, don't hesitate to ask. Here are a few of the questions we often hear from our guests when they first visit:

- ~ How long is the worship service here at Faith? Our worship services typically run 60 to 70 minutes.
- ~ How can I introduce myself? We'd love to meet you after the service; don't hesitate to introduce yourself! You can also visit our webpage (www.faithpresby.org), and click on the "I'm New" tab and then the "Introduce Yourself" button. This is a great way to let the pastoral staff know who you are and how we might welcome and serve you.
- ~ I have kids. Are they welcome here? Absolutely! We love the sounds of children in the sanctuary. During the children's message at the 9:00 a.m. worship service, kids up to 6th grade are invited to come up front to listen in. Having them stay with you to listen is also fine. After the children's message, children are invited down the hall to Room 4 (grades 3 to 6) and Room 5 (Pre-K to 2nd grade) with our children's staff. Nursery care is available throughout the 9:00 a.m. worship service in Room 7.
- ~ **Are there classes for adults?** Yes. Check the bulletin and listen for announcements in worship about upcoming classes. We currently have in-person and online classes.
- ~ What if I have trouble hearing the service? If you have difficulty hearing, please ask one of our ushers for a personal receiver for the hearing impaired. Also, a T-Loop hearing-assist system is available in the back four pews on the right side of the sanctuary. Set your hearing aid to the "T" setting.
- ~ How can I find out more information about Faith? Feel free to speak to any of us and if we can't answer your questions, we'll find somebody who can. Our website is a great source of information: www.faithpresby.org. Also, This Week @ Faith is a weekly email that goes out on Mondays with information about upcoming opportunities and activities. Email Laura Anderson in our office at landerson@faithpresby.org if you'd like to be included on the email distribution list.
- ~What if I'm interested in exploring membership or deeper involvement at Faith? If you'd like to know more about becoming a member at Faith, or want to understand how you can begin or continue to grow in your Christian faith, we encourage you to contact one of our pastors. We'd love to meet you and find out how we can be of help.



Finding Christ in Israel's Seven Festivals

After leading the Israelites out of Egypt, God commanded them in Leviticus 23 to observe seven annual festivals. He even instituted a new calendar to fix their recurrence. Colossians 2:16-17 tells us that we as Christians do not have to observe these Old Testament festivals, but knowing about them should grow our confidence in, and adoration for, our sovereign Lord. Why? Because the first four festivals prophetically anticipated our Lord Jesus Christ's sinless life, death, and resurrection. And now we live in anticipation of the last three festivals, which promise Christ's triumphant return and reign. Join us as we learn about these seven festivals and consider how they point us towards our Lord Jesus Christ.

Rule of Life: The Habit of Prayer
Part 2—Speaking After Being Spoken To

Questions to Consider...

The following questions and scriptures are provided for Life Groups and individuals who want to reflect further on today's message.

- 1. Read Genesis 1:1-8 again. If you're up for it, read the whole chapter of Genesis 1.
- 2. The Lord speaks and creation springs into existence. Why do you think that it is with words that God creates? What does this teach us?
- 3. What do you think about the idea that prayer is "answering" language, that God speaks first to us in scripture and then we speak back in prayer as a response to what we have heard God first say? Is this the way you have prayed in the past?
- 4. How is talking to God in prayer different from, or similar to, talking to another person?
- 5. Writer Eugene Peterson argued, "If we insist on being self-taught in prayer, our prayers, however eloquent, will be meager." Do you agree? Is prayer something that we have to learn? If so, is it God that needs to teach us?
- 6. What do you think about the practice of "The 3 R's?" Does it make sense? See if you can imagine how this might work. Read together the story of the widow's offering in Luke 21:1-4. Consider what the Lord may be saying to us in this story, and then reflect on how you can respond by rejoicing, then repenting, and then requesting.
- 7. Consider the three practices Jeff suggested to help us learn how to make our prayers a response to God's initiating Word to us in scripture. Which one seems like it might be most helpful to you? How do you imagine implementing this in your life this week? Be as specific as possible in the details of your plan.
- 8. Pray together as a group, trying to let your prayers be informed by what the Lord has been saying to you in this message.



Table to Table: Something for kids and adults to consider together

As a family, take a passage of scripture (Luke 21:1-4 would be a good choice) and, after reading and talking about what God is teaching here, talk together about how you might pray to God based on what you have just learned. Use the 3 R's if that helps. Then take a few minutes to pray together.

Meeting With God This Week

To help you LISTEN to God...

For your continued times of meeting with God daily, we offer the following passages from God's Word for your reflection. If you need a Bible, let us know and we'll give you one. We encourage you to keep a journal at hand to write down what you hear as you listen to God's Word. If you are new to all this, these steps may help you get started:

Invite - Find a time and space where you can have at least fifteen minutes of privacy and silence. Begin by taking a moment to simply ask God to meet you. Expect God to answer your prayer and show up.

Scripture - Read slowly through the passage for the day (we offer suggestions below). Read it again, if you like. Pay attention to phrases or ideas that particularly strike you.

Listen and Reflect - Use a journal to write down what you hear God saying in these verses. What is God telling you about himself? What is God telling you about your life? What is God telling you he wants you to do or to do differently? What questions are raised? What promises are revealed? Write what you hear.

Respond - Use the 3 R's. #1 - Rejoice! What have I heard from God which causes me to praise God and give thanks? Pray accordingly. #2—Repent. What have I heard from God that brings to light sin in my life or change that needs to take place? #3—Request. What have I heard from God that informs the way I pray for myself and others? (The guide in the column to the right, "To Help You Speak with God," may be useful as you pray for others this week.)

Simple Guide to Praying the Lord's Prayer

Set aside time to be alone where you can pray the way Jesus teaches us to pray, what we call the Lord's Prayer. You can certainly pray straight through the prayer. Though if you do, try to do so slowly, paying attention to each word and phrase as you speak them to the Lord. It's also helpful to realize that what Jesus may be giving us here are categories for prayer, and an order for those categories. So below you'll find each phrase of the prayer separated out, along



with some prompts to help you expand on that phrase. Some have compared this to decorating a Christmas tree. Think about each phrase of the prayer as a bare branch on the tree. Go down the tree and "decorate" each branch, allowing Jesus' words to inspire and inform your prayers. The prompts offered may help. Keep in mind that every pronoun in the prayer is plural, meaning we are praying for others as we pray for ourselves.

Our Father in heaven... Approach as a beloved son or daughter. Offer prayers of adoration and praise to the sovereign creator and sustainer of all.

Hallowed be your name... Pray for God to reveal himself, to make his name revered in all the world, beginning with us. May every knee bow and every tongue confess.

Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven... Pray for Christ to come back into our world and bring his kingdom and realize his will. Pray for help in submitting our own lives to his will. Pray for our world, especially the places that currently do not resemble heaven. Pray for justice. Pray for healing.

Give us this day our daily bread... Ask God for what you and others need for today. Literal bread, yes. But also a host of other needs. Focus on today.

Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us... Be specific about ways we have failed to love God and others. Pray for those who have not loved you. Receive grace, extend grace.

Lead us not into temptation (or, the time of trial), but deliver us from the evil one... Ask for protection from temptations which often trip you/us up. Ask for protection from spiritual attack.

For yours is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever... End where we began, in praise and adoration.
