Welcome, Guests!

Friends,

We are glad you are here with us and hope you sense God's presence in worship today. If there is any way we can be of help to you, don't hesitate to ask. Here are a few of the questions we often hear from our guests when they first visit:

- ~ How long is the worship service here at Faith? Our worship services typically run 60 to 70 minutes.
- ~ How can I introduce myself? We'd love to meet you after the service; don't hesitate to introduce yourself! You can also visit our webpage (www.faithpresby.org), and click on the "I'm New" tab and then the "Introduce Yourself" button. This is a great way to let the pastoral staff know who you are and how we might welcome and serve you.
- ~ I have kids. Are they welcome here? Absolutely! We love the sounds of children in the sanctuary. During the children's message at the 9:00 a.m. worship service, kids up to 6th grade are invited to come up front to listen in. Having them stay with you to listen is also fine. After the children's message, children are invited down the hall to Room 4 (grades 3 to 6) and Room 5 (Pre-K to 2nd grade) with our children's staff. Nursery care is available throughout the 9:00 a.m. worship service in Room 7.
- ~ Are there classes for adults? Yes. Check the bulletin and listen for announcements in worship about upcoming classes. We currently have in-person and online classes.
- ~ What if I have trouble hearing the service? If you have difficulty hearing, please ask one of our ushers for a personal receiver for the hearing impaired. Also, a T-Loop hearing-assist system is available in the back four pews on the right side of the sanctuary. Set your hearing aid to the "T" setting.
- ~ How can I find out more information about Faith? Feel free to speak to any of us and if we can't answer your questions, we'll find somebody who can. Our website is a great source of information: www.faithpresby.org. Also, *This Week @ Faith* is a weekly email that goes out on Mondays with information about upcoming opportunities and activities. Email Laura Anderson in our office at landerson@faithpresby.org if you'd like to be included on the email distribution list.





Fall Mission and Service Opportunities in Paradise, CA with Presbyterian Disaster Assistance & SOULutions Ministries



OUT OF CHAOS, HOPE

This November marks the 7th anniversary of the Camp Fire, which still ranks as the deadliest and most destructive fire on record in **DISASTER ASSISTANCE** California. Our presbytery, the North Central California Presbytery, in partnership with Presbyterian Disaster Assistance and SOULutions Ministries, is offering two opportunities this November

to go to Paradise and to serve those who continue to rebuild their lives and their community there, all these years after the fire.

Participants will stay at Trinity Presbyterian Church in Oroville, which is a Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Host Site. (Visit their website for more: https://trinityoroville.com/.) There are also three RV hook-ups available for water and power but no waste disposal.

Please note that trip participants must be at least 18 years old.

Here is an overview of the two opportunities:

November 7-11, 2025 — Anniversary Trip

"Join us Friday evening for dinner with speakers. Saturday we will engage in community events to remember the fire. Projects will include planting, building, painting and bringing hope out of chaos." Cost is \$412.50 per person.

November 14-16, 2025

"Join us Friday night for dinner as survivors [of the Camp Fire] share their stories. Saturday we will be the waitstaff at the amazing Tiny Pine Foundation Monte Carlo event. We will set up, be sous-chefs, and serve guests. We will help build Tiny Homes for families." Cost is \$221.50 per person.

- ³ So he told them this parable: ⁴ "Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it? ⁵ When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices. ⁶ And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbors, saying to them, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost.' ⁷ Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who need no repentance.
- ⁸ "Or what woman having ten silver coins, if she loses one of them, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it? ⁹ When she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbors, saying, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost.' ¹⁰ Just so, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents."

Questions to Consider...

The following questions and scriptures are provided for Life Groups and individuals who want to reflect further on today's message.

- 1. Read the passage together again. Consider reading the whole chapter to see how the theme is carried all the way through Chapter 15. What catches your attention that you didn't notice before?
- 2. What types of people are present with Jesus in verses 1 and 2? What is the attitude of each of these groups as Jesus begins to tell these stories?
- 3. In your own short or long journey of pursuing a life with Jesus, do you identify more with the Pharisees and teachers or with the sinners and tax collectors? How does this affect the way you hear these stories of Jesus?
- 4. Read Ezekiel 34, verses 6, 11 and 16. In light of these verses, how does Jesus reflect his Father's heart in the Parables of the Lost Sheep and the Lost Coin? How do these words from Ezekiel confirm or challenge your view of God in the Old Testament?
- 5. Someone might say that it seems the shepherd loved the one lost sheep more than the others (or that the woman thought the lost coin was worth more than the others). Considering what you know of God's character, how would you respond to this? What other scripture passages come to mind that can help shape your answer?
- 6. Can you remember a time when seeing someone come to know the Lord brought you great joy?
- 7. For you as a follower of Jesus (or for us as a church), what does each of the three stages of these parables—Seeking, Finding, and Throwing a Party—look like in real life?
- 8. To close, read the quote below by N. T. Wright. How would you answer his question? "What might today's Christians do that would make people ask, 'Why are you doing something like that?', and give us the chance to tell stories about finding something that was lost?" (Tom Wright, Luke for Everyone, 185).

Meeting With God This Week

To help you LISTEN to God...

For your continued times of meeting with God daily, we offer the following passages from God's Word for your reflection. If you need a Bible, let us know and we'll give you one. We encourage you to keep a journal at hand to write down what you hear as you listen to God's Word. If you are new to all this, these steps may help you get started:

Invite - Find a time and space where you can have at least fifteen minutes of privacy and silence. Begin by taking a moment to simply ask God to meet you. Expect God to answer your prayer and show up.

Scripture - Read slowly through the passage for the day (we offer suggestions below). Read it again, if you like. Pay attention to phrases or ideas that particularly strike you.

Listen and Reflect - Use a journal to write down what you hear God saying in these verses. What is God telling you about himself? What is God telling you about your life? What is God telling you he wants you to do or to do differently? What questions are raised? What promises are revealed? Write what you hear.

Respond - Use the 3 R's. #1 - Rejoice! What have I heard from God which causes me to praise God and give thanks? Pray accordingly. #2—Repent. What have I heard from God that brings to light sin in my life or change that needs to take place? #3—Request. What have I heard from God that informs the way I pray for myself and others? (The guide in the column to the right, "To Help You Speak with God," may be useful as you pray for others this week.)
