Monday

Just as God reached Abraham—and later drew Magi from far-off lands—He still moves toward those who feel far from Him (Isa. 60:1-6). Distance has never been a barrier to the God who keeps His promises. What "distance" in your life do you need to bring honestly to God today?

Tuesday

Abraham looked directly at the facts (his age, Sarah's barrenness) and still trusted God's promise more than his circumstances (Rom. 4:18-25). Biblical faith doesn't deny the reality of our situation; it believes God is greater than it. Where do you need to stop pretending everything is fine and instead choose honest, Christ-centered faith?

Wednesday

When Isaac was born, Abraham and Sarah discovered that God is never late. He is always right on time, and always faithful to what He has spoken. Christmas is the ultimate reminder that God fulfills His promises perfectly (Gal. 4:4). What promise of God do you need to wait for with renewed trust and patience?

Thursday

Before God fulfilled His promise *through* Abraham, He did a deep work *in* Abraham, shaping his trust, patience, and dependence. Waiting may not be God withholding something good; it may be that He's working on you through the process (Phil. 2:12). *How might God be forming you during your current season of waiting?*

Friday

When the Lord asked, "Is anything too hard for the Lord?" (Gen. 18:14), He wasn't just confronting Sarah's doubts. He was inviting her (and us) to renewed trust. Christmas is God's definitive answer: Nothing is too hard for the Lord. Where in your life do you need to hear that question again and answer it with faith?
