**HOW TO MAKE MUCH OF JESUS IN YOUR CITY**

## DAILY REFLECTIONS ON LOVING YOUR CITY

### Monday

Read Jeremiah 29:1-14. God had sent the Jews into exile in Babylon because of their generational disobedience. How did God tell them to love the city of their pagan captors (v. 7)? How are you praying for and seeking the welfare of unchurched people in your life? Blessing them can open their hearts to gospel conversations with you.

### Tuesday

Read Matt. 5:13-16 How can we act as “salt and light” and “let our light shine before others” in our city? Read Luke 10:25-37. How did the Good Samaritan do it? The “N” in living SENT is critical. Ask God who you can “neighbor” this week like Jesus did.

### Wednesday

Read Acts 2:42-47. Based on v. 46-47, what effect did worship have on the lost residents of Jerusalem. Passionate, sincere worship inspires lost people to seek Jesus. Some have called it worship evangelism. When lost people see you making much of Jesus, it inspires them to want to know more. How might a lost person be impacted by your worship?

### Thursday

Read Acts 16. Taking the gospel to Philippi was a dangerous mission for Paul and Silas. How did their courage in the face of persecution affect lost people in the prison? When making much of Jesus is costly, lost people often take notice, and some are open to gospel conversations.

### Friday

Read Acts 17. Paul loved the people in every city he visited by making much of Jesus through gospel conversations and teaching. What was the result (v. 4, 12, 34)? Ask God to give you one or more opportunities for gospel conversations this week. One way to begin is to ask, “Are you a person of faith?” If they say, “No” say, “Really? Why not?” If they say, “Yes” say, “What kind of faith?” Or “Tell me more.” Then you can talk about your faith.
