DAILY REFLECTIONS ON CORE VALUES

Monday: Will Mancini says, “Core values are the shared convictions that guide the actions and reveal the strengths of the church.” With that in mind read Acts 2:42-47. What core values do you see in the early church? Which ones of our CLEAR values do you see here? Which of our values are strongest and which ones do we need to work on? How are you living out the values?

Tuesday: Pastor Matt said on Sunday, “Our CLEAR values define what we celebrate and what we tolerate.” Based on what Jesus did not tolerate in Matthew 23:1-36, authenticity was a core value of Jesus. It takes both courage and humility to call out hypocrisy. It takes courage to confront someone with truth. It takes humility to look for hypocrisy in yourself before you call it out in someone else (Matt. 7:1-5).

Wednesday: We value community through building relationships as we do life and ministry together. Read Ephesians 4:29-32. If you value community, what things are mentioned in these verses that you should not tolerate in your life, family, work, church, etc.? What things should you celebrate? How would you go about that? You may not have complete authority over these matters with other people, but you do have influence. Your influence can have a big impact on community.

Thursday: Community (relationships) is the context in which all our other CLEAR values are expressed. There are 51 “one another” commands in the New Testament that can be grouped into 19 distinct commands. We can’t practice any of those commands without relationships with others. Do a quick internet search to get a list of the “one another” commands. Which one(s) can you work on this week?

Friday: Read Colossians 4:2-6. Which CLEAR value is discussed here? We practice this value by living SENT. Who is your “one” for 2026, the person you feel most drawn to live SENT with this year. What tips for living SENT can you apply from these verses?
