DAILY REFLECTIONS ON MANKIND'S CONDITION

Monday: Read Matthew 5:17-20. What did Jesus say about the relevance of the Law and how long it is valid? What will happen if we relax one of the commandments? How does Jesus take an even stricter interpretation of what the Law requires? Read Matt. 5:21-48. Until we know how much we have sinned, we don't understand how much we need a Savior. Have you placed your trust in Jesus (John 3:16)?

Tuesday: Read John 3:16-21. Most people are familiar with v. 16, but do not read further. Why is everyone already condemned by God if they choose not to believe in Jesus? What does Romans 3:10-12 say? We are all born with a sin nature worthy of condemnation and in need of the saving grace of Jesus. That makes the good news of v. 16-17 the best news ever!

Wednesday: Paul says in Romans 3:11 that no one seeks God. What does God the Father do to change that (John 6:44)? How is the Holy Spirit involved (John 16:8-11)? When someone begins to ask questions and express interest in spiritual things, what do you know about what God is up to in their lives? Their spiritual interest is your invitation from God to live SENT with them and talk about Jesus and your story.

Thursday: Read Romans 3:19 & 14:12; 2 Corinthians 5:10. Imagine yourself standing before God having to give account of your whole life to Him. If He were to ask you, "Why should I let you into heaven", what would you say? There is no more important question in all of life, and there is only one right answer. Do you know it?

Friday: Read Romans 3:19-20. Paul uses the term "the law" to refer to the Laws of Moses in Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy. It is the moral, ethical and spiritual regulations God set forth for the Hebrews. Jesus affirmed it is still relevant to us. Since no one can be justified by keeping the law, what purpose does the law serve? The law diagnoses our hopeless spiritual condition and justified condemnation without God's intervention through Jesus. Your spiritual condition is terminal without faith in Jesus (Romans 6:23; 10:9-10)
