A New Chapter for the Children's Home

Over the years, the Children's Home has been a place of safety, growth, and love for many children in Haiti. Today, we are entering a new season in this ministry.

All of the children in our care - except one - have now reached adulthood and transitioned out of the home. In Haiti, when a child turns 18, the government requires that he or she leave the children's home and return to extended family or begin independent living.

This is not the end of the mission. It is the completion of one chapter and the beginning of another.

These young people did not leave empty - they left equipped. They were raised in a safe environment, educated, cared for, and grounded in faith.

We currently have one remaining child in the home: **Josette, age 16**. She will continue to live under the care of our administrator while completing her education over the next two years.

Growing Together

The children continue to grow together in both their education and their faith. The school remains a place of learning, encouragement, and structure.

Even in difficult circumstances, the consistency of the school provides stability and hope for both the children and their families. It is a place where children are not only taught academics, but also taught truth, discipline, and character.

Teachers continue to invest in the lives of the students daily, helping them develop confidence and a sense of purpose. Parents remain supportive and engaged, recognizing the importance of education and spiritual guidance in their children's lives.

This school is more than a building. It is a foundation for the future of these children, providing both knowledge and a firm spiritual grounding that will serve them for years to come.

The Church at Anjubo

The church at Anjubo continues to grow, even in the midst of difficult conditions. Despite the impact of gangs in the area, the church is moving forward by the grace of God.

Throughout the 2025–2026 year, the church has remained active with regular prayer services held several times each week. In addition, they have hosted evangelism conferences and Bible study programs.

There have been **7 conversions to faith in Christ** and **12 rededications**. On many Sundays, if everyone attends, the church is filled.

The church is building a small covered porch to protect from rain and heat. Some benches need repair or replacement, and they are requesting financial help.

There is also a need to construct a new women's restroom, estimated to cost less than **\$800**.
