Summer Savings for Anjubo School

The Voice of Children USA includes the support of a school in Anjubo which is on a mountain. This school extends from pre-kindergarten to the 5th grade. There are 80 students being educated there all because of this ministry. Education is important to the Haitian people, but unfortunately there are no public schools, especially in the rural areas.

We provide books, supplies, uniforms and lunch for these students who more than likely would not be in school if it were not for TVOCUSA. In Haiti 90% of schools are administered by churches, 61% of Haitians are illiterate and 33% of children ages 6 to 12 do not attend school because their



families can not afford the tuition and uniforms.

In the United State we are so blessed to have public schools which provide books, lunch and sometimes transportation. However in Haiti some students walk up to 2 hours

per student) were \$20. They are handed down so we do not have to provide new uniforms each year to each student. With 80 students there is a cost of approximately \$3000 for books. Last year we spent almost \$1000 for uniforms. Please note meeting these costs would not

The Children realize they are blessed and are grateful to be able to attend school and have a hot lunch provided even in view of the distance they have to travel to get there.

The Principal, Pastor Volner Flovilus, purchases the books and school supplies at the public market. Last year the cost was approximately \$37 for each student. Uniforms (2



have been possible were it not for the generous donations from our TVOCUSA supporters. We are forever grateful.

CHILDREN'S HOME IN GRESSIER,

Our children's home is doing well. Everyone is healthy and growing. We have found a new school for our 10 children to attend this year. It is within walking distance of our home and thankfully it has a security wall around the entire school grounds. The school is well-staffed and very clean. The tuition fees are



less than the prior school we used, thus we were able to save some money.

The tuition fees and materials for the school uniforms now cost \$2,034.00. School books/Notebooks, shoes, and personal items, etc, for each child cost

\$2,900. We pray that God continues to touch the hearts of His people and thus provide new donors and/or increased donations. This will enable us to continue to meet the needs of the children in view of the rapid increases in costs

We purchased 3 sewing machines for our home last year. Our staff and children have been trained to sew. The school uniforms for our home were made by Lusa, who oversees the care of our girls, and by the children themselves. Each child in our home has also sewn their own church clothes during this year. We purchase the fabric and the children enjoy the activity of developing and perfecting their sewing skills. They are very proud of the clothes they have made, and we are very proud of our children.



FOOD SHORTAGES AND TROUBLE IN HAITI

The Principal of our school and our Home Administrator have been keeping us updated about problems in Haiti. The people of Haiti are starving due to food shortages. The food that is available is so expensive they cannot purchase it. A small bag of rice is \$595 Haitian dollars (which is about \$50 American). The average Haitian makes about \$200 dollars a year.

Haiti is only getting about 69 percent of the gasoline the country needs. However, only about twenty percent of the gasoline makes it to the gas stations. Gasoline was around \$10 per gallon, but most of the gas is sold on the black market for about \$30 per gallon or more.

There is a lot of rioting in Haiti because the people are hungry. They are protesting the government (or lack of government). Our missionaries fly from Port-a-Prince to Jacmel to



avoid areas that have a lot of gang violence. The violence has spread to the Jacmel area now. They have had riots and shootings there also.

An American missionary friend in Gressier had trouble last week. He went out to buy food and water and ran into riots on the streets. He made it home with a little food and no water. We feel that it will not be



safe for our missionaries to return to Haiti until most of the trouble has been stopped. Please keep our ministry and our children in your prayers. This has always been a safe area, but the unrest is spreading all across the country, making it difficult to visit and more importantly, for the natives to live.
