

# GATES of GRATITUDE

Week 26 | November 25, 2024

In biblical times, gates had **tremendous significance**. They were where important matters of commerce and *governance* took place and were symbols of <u>influence and authority</u>. Therefore, when the Bible describes entering the **gates of the Lord** it is describing coming into and taking part in the *kingdom of God*, reigning with our <u>sovereign Father</u> as His **holy children**. As we do so, scripture makes it *abundantly clear* the kind of <u>attitude and mindset</u> we are to have. (Psalm 100:4)

Without this **proper perspective**, the *power* and *influence* of God's children will be greatly hindered because when we act <u>outside of God's will</u>, the Christian's ability to produce **spiritual fruit** and see their *prayers answered* is <u>severely limited</u> (1 Thess. 5:18-19; 1 John 5:14-15; John 15:5). And so, as we pray for the people of our **families**, **churches**, and **communities** we are asking God to instill within us an *attitude of gratitude* over **WHO** He is and for everything that He:

## 1. **HAS DONE** (Psalm 100:3; Psalm 136)

- a. NOTE: God has been so good to us. He created us, called us, and carried us out of our old sinful lives—and that's just the beginning. Time and again He has poured out blessings into our lives through various forms of grace and mercy, yet we are so forgetful. Pray for God to give us a holy remembrance of the things He has done in days gone by. Even if He never did anything more, what He has already accomplished is worthy of our eternal worship and thanks. (Psalm 105:1-2,5; Psalm 92:1-4)
  - i. For Ex. "Lord God, thank You for Your goodness, grace, and mercy. Thank You for all that You have done *in us*, *for us*, and *through us* over the years. I ask, Father, that You would spark within us a <u>holy and uncompromisable</u> memory, that we might not forget all of the good You have done. I *plead the blood* of Jesus over our every <u>thought and recollection</u>, asking that You wash them clean of all that is *evil*, *wicked*, and *sinful*. May we remember <u>who You are</u> and all that You've done, giving You every bit of the *thanksgiving* and *praise* that You <u>truly deserve</u>."
    - REMEMBER: Demonic forgetfulness causes our memory of God's goodness to <u>slip away</u>. (Judges 8:33-34)

## 2. <u>IS DOING</u> (Psalm 100:3; Psalm 23)

a. **NOTE:** God is still **actively moving** all around us. The problem is that we don't recognize His presence or His <u>hand at work</u> in our lives. When we **fail to see** His guidance, influence, and intervention in our <u>day to day</u> we can quickly become **bitter** and **ungrateful**. Ask God to open our eyes to see <u>where He is working</u> so that we can **join Him there** and give Him thanks for acting as our <u>shepherd</u>, <u>king</u>, and <u>father</u>. (John 5:17; Colossians 1:17)

- i. For Ex. "Dear God, thank You for remaining actively at work in our lives today. Thank You for continuing to watch over, speak to, and fight for us each and every day. I ask, Lord, that You would open up our eyes so that we might see the influence and impact of Your hand in our lives. Unstop our ears so that we might hear what You are saying. Soften our hearts so that we can respond in thanksgiving and gratitude as You reveal Yourself powerfully and personally to the watching world and to Your sheep, subjects, and children."
  - REMEMBER: Satan strives to block our ability to see God at work in our lives. (2 Corinthians 4:4)

## 3. WILL DO (Psalm 100:5; Psalm 145:10,13)

a. **NOTE:** Scripture is full of the **amazing promises** of God. Because He is a *man of His word*, and because His character will remain <u>forever unchanged</u>, we can find **solace in** and **express gratitude** for the *goodness that God has guaranteed* even when we <u>haven't seen it</u> yet. Pray for **hope that holds on** to His *assurances* and for faith in His <u>future blessings</u> so that we can **thank Him now** for all He <u>will do</u> later on.

(Psalm 105:8; Psalm 107:1; Jeremiah 29:11)

- i. For Ex. "Father God, thank You for giving us a glimpse into what the future holds. Thank You for all of the powerful promises found in Your word and for the hope and strength that they offer. Give us today the faith to believe and the resolve to hold on to what You have said so that we might praise and thank You for Your future goodness and grace here and now."
  - 1. **REMEMBER:** The Enemy's goal is to sow **seeds of doubt** in our hearts about *the validity of God's word*. (Genesis 3:1)

#### **Questions for Reflection:**

- Has your forgetfulness robbed you of gratitude? What memory has Satan sought to hide?
  - The Evil One **cannot** erase every trace of *God's goodness* in your life. <u>Hold on</u> to what you do remember, and *follow the bread crumbs* to what He seeks to reveal in His timing.
- Do you see God at work in your life? Are you experiencing His movement daily?
  - Instead of asking Him to bless what you do, ask Him to reveal what He is already blessing. Then join Him there and reap the abundant harvest He has prepared!
- Are you *struggling to believe* God's **promises** for <u>the future</u>?
  - As you learn more about who God is, remember that He is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow. Because <u>His nature is unchanging</u>, we know that He can and will accomplish all that He has <u>said He would</u>.
