

HOLY FORGETFULNESS

Week 32 | January 6, 2025

One of the **greatest gifts** God can bless us with is *a short memory*. The Biblical concept of **forgetfulness** is so much more *than a cognitive process* of <u>the brain</u>. Instead, to forget means to to **let go** of, **move on** from, and no longer **hold onto** something or someone. This does not come *naturally* to most of us, but in it there is so much <u>freedom and life</u>. That's why this week we are praying for God to bless us with a **Holy Forgetfulness** that *releases us* from:

1. Our <u>PAST</u> (Hebrews 8:12)

- a. **NOTE:** We all have **baggage**. Much of it comes from the *mistakes we've made* along the way and the failures that often keep us up at night. Christ came to **redeem** even *our past*, and one of the ways that He does so is by granting us a holy forgetfulness of our sins from days gone by. Once **confessed** and **repented** of, the only purpose in bringing up *former failings* is to learn additional lessons from them or for the **benefit** and **encouragement** of others. Any other agenda is from **the enemy** in an attempt to *hold us back* in shame and guilt. (Isaiah 43:25; Revelation 12:10)
 - i. For Ex. "Father God, thank You for forgiving us our sins through Jesus' death on the cross. Thank You for wiping the slate clean, remembering no more the failures of our past. The enemy has tried to convince us that we are still held as guilty for all of those mistakes, but they are wrong. Please silence their lies at this moment and instead, Lord, grant us a holy forgetfulness of the times we have fallen so that we can move onward towards what You have planned."
 - 1. **REMEMBER:** Self-shaming is a fruit of pride. It is **arrogant** to <u>fixate on</u> something that God has *forgiven you* of. (Psalm 51:7)

2. Our PAIN (Colossians 3:13)

- a. NOTE: We all have painful memories that we wish we could forget. Many of these are a result of the wounds inflicted by others over the years and oftentimes leave nasty scars as time goes by. God also wants to release us from this pain so that we can move forward into the wonderful plans He has in store for the future. Through forgiveness, He has given us the tool to do so, even modeling the way through Jesus. Because forgiveness sets us free and allows us to forget all of the ways others have hurt us, it makes sense that our enemy would seek to keep us in bondage by consistently dredging up old memories and past hurts that have already been dealt with. (Ephesians 4:32; 2 Corinthians 2:10-11)
 - i. For Ex. "Lord Jesus, thank You for paying the price of our sins on the cross of cavalry. Thank You for <u>loving us</u> while we were still Your enemies and for forgiving us before <u>we even asked</u>. Grant us today the desire and power to forgive others as You have <u>forgiven us</u> so that we might be freed from the painful echo of what they did. Come into that memory, Lord, and <u>wipe it clean</u> by the power of Your blood. For the cross was sufficient, for my sins and for theirs."

1. **REMEMBER:** *Harboring unforgiveness* limits your **growth** by hindering your <u>hearing and healing</u>. (Matthew 18:32-35)

3. Our PREFERENCE (Isaiah 43:18-19)

- a. **NOTE:** Over time we all develop **hopes**, **dreams**, and **ambitions** as well as a certain inclination to our former and *preferred way* of doing things. While many of these <u>plans of ours</u> may **seem harmless** on the surface, they are *powerful tools* for <u>the enemy</u> when they interfere with God's **sovereign agenda**. God longs to *set us free* from even this as <u>we surrender</u> all of **our expectations** to Him and instead *seek after His will* for our lives. It can be an <u>unpleasant process</u>, but the **promises of God** await all of those who are willing to *give up* and *forget* their <u>preferences for life</u>. (Matthew 5:3; Matthew 16:25)
 - i. For Ex. "Holy Spirit, thank You for leading us into all truth and for teaching us the will of the Father. Thank You for working in us to mold and shape us into the image of Christ. Please come now and fill, search, and guide us along the path You wish us to follow and send down Your fire to burn away any of our personal preferences, agendas, or expectations that might interfere. Set us free from our former way of thinking and instead grant us the ability to see things from Your point of view."
 - 1. **REMEMBER:** Holding on to **expectations** leads to <u>confusion</u>, <u>discouragement</u>, and <u>disillusionment</u>. (John 6:60,66)

Questions for Reflection:

- Are feelings of guilt over your past keeping you from producing fruit in the present?
 - Forgive yourself for the mistakes you've made (<u>surrendering them</u> to God) and when the **enemy** tries to bring them up remind them that *the cross* has already <u>paid that price</u>.
- Has God grown quiet in your life? Has your growth and healing slowed or stagnated?
 - Examine yourself for any trace of unforgiveness. Confess it to God and give to Him whatever they did so that you can be set free by "remembering no more" their sin.
- Are you facing confusion or discouragement in your life? Have you become disillusioned with your faith, dissatisfied with your job, or discontent with your family?
 - Ask God to <u>search you</u> and reveal what **unmet expectation** you are *holding onto*.
 Break the <u>demonic agreements</u> associated with it and instead **embrace God's plan** with *faith-fueled contentment*.
